Goodfellows seek happy holidays

The Farmington-Farmington Hills Goodfellows are at it again and they're asking for help to make sure every child has a Merry Christmas.

More than 100 volunteers will hit the streets tomorrow to participate in the annual paper drive, which raises a substantial portion of the money to provide clothes, food and gifts for families in the area who otherwise would have to go without on Christmas.

General Chairman Ed Lage says the community response already has been overwhelming in terms of volunteers who number in the hundreds. Other persons wishing to volunteer time, money, gifts or materials can call Lane at 474-2440.

Although the paper sale is expected to raise between \$1,500 and \$2,000, volunteer help is a primary concern presently with a special need for vans to deliver the gift packages to the more than 200 families on Dec. 21.

"We've got about 200 or so homes to deliver to, which means about 500-600 persons for which to provide. So there is a need for just about everything so we can provide a good Christmas for everyone," says Lane.

JUST ABOUT every club in the twin city area is joining in on this year's effort including the Jaycees, Kiwanis, Lions, Exchange, Elks and Optimist

Clubs. Other organizations throwing in a helping hand are the CB Helping Hands, the Farmington Schools, the schools' varsity clubs and the cities' police and fire departmental units.

Also, some of the businesses in town have agreed to match funds donated for employees of their concern.

Proceeds from the paper sale, which will last from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., go to services which include the food baskets, dresses and shirts for the needy families. Men and women are needed for packing and distributing donations.

Executive director for this year's drive is Farmington Mayor Richard Tupper. Co-General Chairmen are Lane and Marty Burke.

Other officers are Ed Dodson, treasurer; Gerald Grace, assistant treasurer; Fred Menke, secretary; Bill O'Connor, assistant secretary; and advisors Chuck Bridges and Jim Stevens.

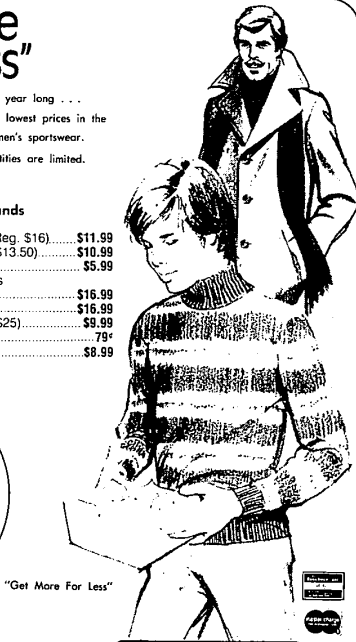
