Adventist Encampment Hears Friend Of Dr. Dooley

Richard C. Hall, 33, doesn't look like a doctor and he isn't, but that didn't stop a desperate plea for a new hospital in Farmington from asking for his help.

When the late Dr. Tom Dooley left his clinic-hospital in the village, she decided he treat her critically ill child. Though Hall protested that he was not a doctor, the mother replied: "You are an American, Dr. Dooley was an American. So you can heal my child."

That was only the first of many cases "doctor" Hall handled in Nantha. When he encountered symptoms he had no answer for, he had a pilot friend fly the list of complaints to Dr. Dooley asking him to send back medicines for healing.

The remote-control arrangement is one of many Hall has used successfully in the back-country jungles of Laos, Thailand, Sarawak, and Brunei where he has served as a Seventh-day Adventist missionary.

Last week he attended the centennial celebration of Adventist Camp Meetings and spoke to some 20,000 members on the Grand Lodge Camp grounds this Saturday.

Hall is back in the United States on a tour which includes a jungle-leaping missionary plane which met with disaster when it dropped from a sling while being ferried from a back-country airstrip to Kuching, Sarawak, by an RAF British helicopter.

The missionary had been assured by natives at a little airstrip—one of a series he has had built to handle his mission plane—that the ground was dry and firm. But when he rolled down the strip on landing, his plane sank into mire two feet of soft earth and tipped onto its back.

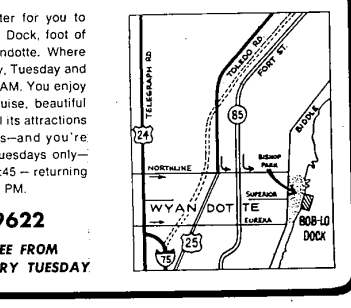
The Royal Air Force graciously agreed to bring the plane out to Kuching for minor repairs, but while about 400 feet off the ground, the sling broke and the plane dropped, completely destroying it.

"Without the plane," says Hall, who is president of the Adventists' Sarawak-Brunei Mission, "I was lost in my missionary work. We used it continually to ferry critically ill persons out of the rain forests to five hospitals in Sarawak and Brunei. The plane had saved scores of lives."

State's Rat Removal Progressing

EAST LANSING -- Progress has been reported in Michigan State University's efforts to accelerate removal of pesticide residues from animals systems.

Dairy scientists D. G. Brandt, L. J. Brown and J. T. Huber contaminated a group of rats with the pesticide, dieldrin, and fed half of them the drug hepatobal. At the end of just 14 days, residues stored in body fat of treated rats were reduced by 75 per cent.

HEPTABAL also proved effective in treating animals already contaminated with dieldrin. Rats were fed the drug during a six-week decontamination period. A 96 per cent reduction in stored dieldrin was found.

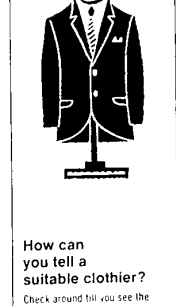
