awarded a certificate to meet FAA requirements.

- Instrument ground school: 7-10 p.m., Mondays, Room 7, for 10 weeks; \$30 fee. Course covers fundamentals of instrument flying, aerodynamics, instruments, radio, regulations, navigation, meteorology and flight procedures. Upon successful completion of course, students will be awarded a certificate to meet FAA requirements.
- Parenting: Call 476-3840 for advanced registration and details on time and dates; \$5 fee. Farmington Youth Assistance, through the efforts of the Subcommittee Family Education, again will be offering study groups for more effective parenting skills. Two groups meet for approximately nine weeks.
- Driver education for adults: For adults, 18 years or over, the course offers behind the wheel instruction in a dual controlled car. Individualized schedules will be arranged. Call the community education office at 477-1300 for information.
- Real estate: 7-9 p.m., Thursdays, Room 7, for 10 weeks; \$15 fee.

Designed for those interested in understanding the fundamentals of real estate, the course supplies helpful information and develops personal competency in various kinds of transactions, basic legal documents, tract index, mortgages, contracts, real estate law, investment potential, and other helpful information.

- Beginners bridge (Goren): 7-9 p.m., Thursdays, Room 16, for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. Course for beginners, covering hand counting, evaluation and bidding. Playing of hands interspersed with instruction to assist players and aid in gaining playing experience.
- Intermediate bridge (Goren): 7-9 p.m., Wednesdays, Room 16, for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. Course in play of specially prepared hands and/or playing experience. Play preceded by rapid review of bidding fundamentals, lead, play and defense instruction, and instruction of certain bidding conventions.
- Photography: 7-9 p.m., Wednesdays, Room 18, for 10 weeks; \$18 fee. An introductory course which deals with the basic fundamentals of the camera, lenses, exposure, composition, motion, depth of field, lighting, color and filters.
- Photography II: 7-9 p.m., Mondays, Room 14, for 10 weeks; \$18 fee. A more serious discussion of the fine points of photography for those who have mastered the fundamentals. Course will include advanced lighting and composition, special exposure problems, close-up photography, and photographing people.
- Square dancing: 7:30-9:30 p.m., Wednesdays, in the gym, for 10 weeks; \$15 a couple fee. For those who have never square danced or who have been out of square dancing for some time. Wear flat or comfortable shoes.
- Welding: 7-10 p.m., Tuesdays, Room 106G (Farmington Senior High), for 10 weeks; \$25 fee, materials extra. Basic experience in gas and arc welding techniques. Gas welding will include fusion-welding, fillerrod welding and brazing. Arc welding will include coding of electrodes, joint preparation, testing.
- Auto tune-up and repair: 7-10 p.m., Thursdays, Room 107G (Farmington Senior High), for 10 weeks; \$22 fee. Using electronic diagnostic equipment, learn minor tune-up and repairs.
- Know your car: 7-9 p.m.,

Tuesdays, Room 107G (Farmington Senior High), for 10 weeks; \$18 fee. This course is designed primarily for women or men who want to learn how and when to maintain their cars. Some trouble shooting experiences.

- Guitar: Beginning students—7:30-8:30 p.m.; Beginning II students—8:30-9:30 p.m.; Tuesdays, Room 15, for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. Folk guitar. Learn to tune, play chords and simple melodies. Bring guitar, loose-leaf notebook, and pencil first night.
- Speed reading and comprehension skills: 7-9 p.m., Wednesdays, Room 212B (Farmington Senior High), for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. Designed to help the individual improve his reading rate, concentration, vocabulary and critical comprehension. Class discussion, practice with visual aids, reading selections with comprehension checks.
- Introduction to ballet for adults: 7-9 p.m., Thursdays, Room 13, for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. Learn ballet. A class for teenagers and adults that will provide appreciation of performance, as well as movement, knowledge, and technique of classical ballet.

BUSINESS CLASSES include:

- Beginning typing: 7-10 p.m., Mondays, Room 2, for 10 weeks; \$18 fee. Basic introductory course. Drill on speed and accuracy.
- Intermediate typing: 7-10 p.m., Tuesdays, Room 2, for 10 weeks; \$18 fee. Intermediate and advanced students. Drill on speed and accuracy. Includes work on typing letters, tabulations and reports. (Electric machines)
- Gregg shorthand for beginners: 7-9 p.m., Thursdays, Room 2, for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. You will be given the fundamentals of Gregg shorthand and dictation. Textbook extra.
- Gregg shorthand (Beginners II): 7-9 p.m., Wednesdays, Room 116 (East Junior High), for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. This course continues the study of the principles of Gregg shorthand. Much more emphasis is placed on developing speed in taking dictation. Textbook extra.
- Gregg shorthand refresher course: 7-9 p.m., Tuesdays, Room 2, for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. This class is a review of the principles of Gregg shorthand. Emphasis is on building dictation and transcription speeds. (Come prepared the first night with shorthand notebook, typing paper, eraser, etc.) Textbook extra.
- Shorthand A-B-C stenoscrypt: 7-9:30 p.m., Tuesdays and Thursdays, Room 101C (Farmington Senior High); for eight weeks; \$30 fee. Stenoscrypt, the easy to learn shorthand system written with the ab's. No symbols to learn. Learn to take dictation at 80 to

100 words per minute by the end of the course. Textbook extra.

- Accounting and bookkeeping I: 7-9 p.m., Mondays, Room 18, for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. The fundamentals of bookkeeping and principles of accounting procedures. Textbook extra.
- Accounting and bookkeeping II: 7-9 p.m., Thursdays, Room 18, for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. A continuation of the accounting and bookkeeping I class.
- Business machines: 7-9 p.m., Mondays, Room 105C (Farmington Senior High), for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. Learn to use many common machines found in offices, such as calculators, duplicating machines, dictaphones, etc.
- Money Mystique: 7-9 p.m., Mondays, Room 17, for four weeks; \$9 fee. Topics considered include: stock market versus money markets; bank interest versus corporate bonds; whole life insurance versus low cost pure protection; U.S. Series "E" bonds versus treasury bonds; cash value savings versus mutual fund investing. The importance of estate planning and how to set up a living trust to avoid the cost of probate.

WEDNESDAYS, kitchen, for five weeks; \$12 fee plus materials. Basic cooking for those alone. Instruction in preparing tasty and nutritious meals. Tips on entertaining. Lab fee approximately \$1 each class meeting.

- Adventures in good cooking: 7-10 p.m., Wednesdays, kitchen, for five weeks beginning Feb. 15; \$12 fee plus materials. Learn to prepare appetizers, entrees and desserts.
- Gourmet cooking: 7-9:30 p.m., Tuesdays, kitchen, for eight weeks; \$20 fee, materials extra. Advanced food preparation for entertaining includes hors d'oeuvres, cooking with wines, souffles, crepes, meats and seafood dishes as well as unusual desserts.
- Microwave cooking: 7-9 p.m., Wednesdays, Room 9 (Farmington Senior High), for four weeks; \$10 fee plus materials. Conserve time and energy while enjoying new and creative dishes prepared in the latest microwave oven.
- Sewing for beginners: 7-10 p.m., Wednesdays, Room 9, for 10 weeks; \$18 fee. Individual attention, use of the machine, layout, cutting, marking, fitting, and construction techniques.
- Needlepoint: 7-9 p.m., Thursdays, Room 10, for five weeks; \$10 fee. Learn 16 needlepoint stitches using sampler techniques and apply design to your own pattern. \$11 kit to be purchased. Bring sharp scissors.
- Upholstery: 6:30-9:30 p.m., Mondays, the basement of Farmington Senior High, for 10 weeks; \$20 fee. Brighten and modernize your home by learning and putting into use the basic fundamentals of upholstery. Group demonstration and individual instruction. Tools and a large selection of materials can be purchased. Bring your chair the first night of class.

LANGUAGE CLASSES include:

- French I (conversational): 7-9 p.m., Thursdays, Room 17, for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. Everyday French for adults in an informal course for the student with no previous exposure to the French language. Use of language laboratory and professional tapes.
- French II (conversational): 7-9 p.m., Wednesdays, Room 18, for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. A continuation of French I for those students having had previous exposure to the French language. Use of language laboratory and professional tapes.
- Spanish I (conversational): 7-9 p.m., Mondays, Room 19, for 10 weeks; \$15 fee. This course is designed to give the students a knowledge of the fundamentals of conversational Spanish. For beginners.

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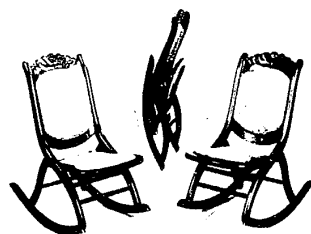
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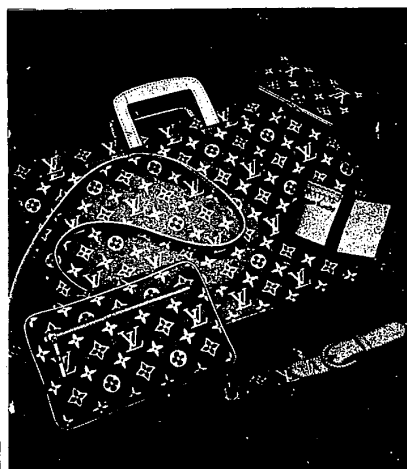
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
