


'Open Door' To Bridge Generations



Dems Scorn Budget Offered By County

Unless the board of supervisors does a turnaround, next year's Oakland County budget is going to leave the Democrats thoroughly dissatisfied.

Aldo Vagnozzi, Democratic chairman of the 19th Congressional District and Democratic secretary of Oakland County, has blasted the proposed budget on behalf of county Democrats.

"We submit that this budget does not begin to meet the priority needs of Oakland County," Vagnozzi said.

THE PROPOSED budget was recently reported out of committee to the supervisors who will act on it in the fall.

Conspicuously absent was an appropriation for the Office of Economic Opportunity — the embattled war-on-poverty's central agency.

OEO had requested \$138,000. OEO requested and received only \$25,000 last year for special services.

Chuck Holmes, OEO county deputy director, admitted that OEO's request had been late and large. OEO is asking \$41,000 for the adult dental clinic and \$97,000 for the senior citizens program.

Both programs were started as experimental pilot projects out of federal funds to demonstrate a need. The dental clinic has operated out of the county health department while being financed by OEO. The senior citizens program has been highly successful for four years.

"Now that we've shown there's a need for such programs," Holmes noted, "we need local funds to continue them."

Vagnozzi agreed, "An expenditure for OEO in the coming budget would be an investment

from which the county would reap benefits in the future."

CHARLES EDWARDS, board of supervisors chairman, said he expects the board to appropriate some money for OEO in the final budget. Edwards said the budget committee didn't have enough time to consider the OEO request fully.

Sources said the board will likely give \$41,000 to the health department to continue the dental clinic thereby bypassing OEO and will probably give OEO \$50,000 for senior citizens.

"I don't care who handles the clinic just as long as it stays open," Holmes said. "And I sincerely hope we can keep the senior citizens program intact."

If the senior citizens program is dropped, older citizens would have to approach OEO on an individual basis.

THE PRESENT program enables senior citizens as a group to qualify for OEO functions and benefits. Farmington's "Drop-In Society" recently joined the Oakland County Senior Citizens Council under OEO.

"The Democratic party's major goal is to meet the human needs of the people of Oakland County," concluded Vagnozzi, who resides in Farmington. "We place on the priority list revised social welfare services, improved mental health services, housing, job opportunities, transportation, youth and retiree services and law enforcement."

Since OEO is responsible for many of those tasks, Vagnozzi singled out the OEO appropriation. But he also chastised the budget for "short-changing the mentally ill and
