Taxpayers Organize Statewide

Oakland County taxpayers have joined hands with three other counties to organize a state-wide citizens group to be known as the Michigan Citizens for Tax Reform.

Besides Oakland, the other counties joining the league are Lapeer, Macomb and Genesee. Impetus for combining came from the Oakland County Taxpayers and Homeowners Association and its president, George Williams.

At its first meeting in Lake Orion Township Hall, the delegates from the four counties adopted bylaws. The bylaws set the group's purpose as "to pursue all legal means to bring about a system of fair and equitable taxation for all Michigan taxpayers."

A steering committee was formed to arrange for the first annual meeting to be held next September. Members of the steering committee are: Williams from Oakland County; Earl Charles Sr., from Genesee; James Hardy from Lapeer; and Sam Trentacosta from Macomb.
