Purpose of the meeting is to bring together as many of the property owners and tenants on Grant River between Grace and Power and the Board of Commerce general membership plus interested citizens to discuss long-range plans for the downtown area.

Discussed will be planning for commercial development, community planning and architectural improvement of the community.

The Board of Commerce has announced its intentions to "serve as a liaison between the property owners and the governmental units, both city and township, as we work for the best economic development of our area."

Following the "Birmingham Story" by Smith there will be opportunity for discussion concerning Farmington's problems.
