

Beauty reaches from head to toe for the entire wedding party

Entire wedding parties, from flower girls to grandmothers, are not getting a head-to-toe pick-me-up at Mira Linder Aesthetics as the last step in preparations before the bride takes her first step down the aisle.

Ms. Linder calls it "wedding cosmetology," a service that started when the first wedding party reserved the salon's ten member staff for an entire day of massages, facials, pedicures, manicures, hair styling and make-up application.

It is the newest feature in the salon at 29563 Northwestern Highway, owned and operated by Ms. Linder, who is president of the Michigan Chapter of the International Committee of Aesthetics and Cosmetology.

"I am pleased with the community reception of this service. Brides should feel confident, radiant and beautiful, and that is precisely the way they feel when they leave here."

She is a long-time advocate of the philosophy that skin care is not a luxury, but rather a fact of health.

"WINTER is hard on your skin," Ms. Linder says. "Extreme cold out-

side and dry, heated inside combine to rob it of moisture and elasticity. The combination makes blotches, makes your skin flaky, tight and dull."

All of the treatments given in the salon, she said, such as collagen and hot aniline masks, are put together to adjust to the individual skin type as well as the Michigan climate.

The treatments are followed up with a nourishing, hydrating and protecting do-it-yourself at home process.

The fine art of make-up, with individual attention given to each client and her particular needs, is demonstrated regularly at the salon.

"But putting makeup on a face that is not meticulously clean is like painting on a dirty canvas," she says.

All consultations, for a skin problem, or for correct make-up application, are given without charge.

Among her clients are some of the area's most prominent society women, and many local television personalities, though she emphasizes that she caters as well to women who have to stretch their budgets to allow for the service.

Synagogue to honor Rt. Rev. Msgr. Kern

In observance of Brotherhood Week, a Southfield synagogue will honor the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Clement Kern, noted interfaith leader at a Brotherhood Service and Luncheon.

Fr. Kern will be honored at Sabbath services beginning at 10 a.m. on Saturday, Feb. 11 at Congregation Shaarey Zedek at 27375 Bell Road. A brotherhood sermon is scheduled for 11 a.m. Fr. Kern, retired pastor of Most Holy Trinity Catholic Church, has been one of this community's most eloquent spokesmen for civil and human rights and for all matters pertaining to the growth and development of greater Detroit.

He was ordained as a priest in 1933 and was assigned to Most Holy Trinity Church in 1943. In the area surrounding his church, which was undergoing ethnic changes into a community of

Mexican-Americans, Fr. Kern exercised distinguished leadership.

He mobilized efforts to alleviate the burdens and brighten the lives of the poor, the deprived and the disenfranchised. His efforts have been directed toward the welfare of the labor movement, urban renewal, the United Farm Workers, fair housing and the Latino community.

Fr. Kern's influence has gone far beyond his parish. He has expressed consistent identification with the redemption of the Jewish people in Israel and has shown deep concern for the plight of Soviet Jewry. For this, he was cited by the Labor Zionist movement and Histadrut, Israel's labor organization.

The Detroit Round Table and other interfaith groups have been the recipients of his guidance and wisdom, and his admirers can be found among the diverse religious, racial and social groups of the metropolitan area.

Retired from active ministry, Fr. Kern is now a pastor-in-residence at St. John's Seminary and continues to impart the high ideals, that are intrinsic to his character.

Irving Laker is president of the Shaarey Zedek Men's Club and Dr. Fred Averbuch is lunch chairman.

Rev. Alex J. Brunetti, director of the ecumenical office and theological commission of the Archdiocese of Detroit and Fr. Bill Carroll of St. Mary's Parish in Jackson, along with Rabbi Irwin Groner of the congregation, will participate in the program.

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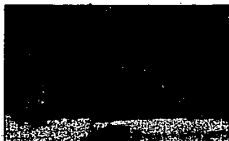
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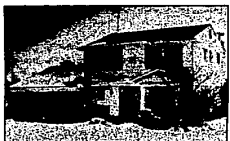
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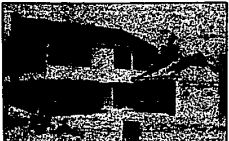
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
