## Buffs eye world team tennis

There is an effort to start world team tennis competition in Oakland County for adults.  
Chris Pedano of the Billie Jean King Tennis Center in Pontiac is trying to organize an Oakland County World Team Tennis league.  
He hopes to have eight teams of eight players apiece.

Sign-up date for the league is Feb. 9. A player draft will be conducted Feb. 10. Team practices will be held Feb. 11-17. Matches will begin Feb. 18 and 19.  
Anyone interested in coaching or sponsoring a team should contact Pedano at 674-0368.  
Each team will consist of four male

and four female players. Players must be 21 or older as of June 1, 1978. No player may be a tennis professional or playing on a college team, unless an exception is made by an Arbitration Committee.  
Each player must pay a \$10 deposit upon signing up. When drafted, the balance of \$50 per player must be paid prior to the first match.  
All matches will be free of charge

and tennis balls will be provided for each match.  
ALL TEAMS must have a sponsor. The sponsor fee is \$30, which will be applied to furnishing tennis balls, trophies and to help pay for court time.  
Each team is responsible for obtaining a sponsor.




