Pontiac Mall—A juried exhibit of oils, acrylics, watercolors, charcoal, pastels, textiles, metal work and ceramics, will be on display through Feb. 19. This is the 10th annual Oakland County art show and more than \$1,000 worth of prizes, certificates, scholarships, art supplies and ribbons are awarded by the judges. Ken Gross, director of the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Association, and Mary Jane Jacobs,

assistant curator of modern art at the Detroit Institute of Arts, were the judges. Artist and architect Maxwell Wright of Union Lake has a one-man show within the exhibition. Mall hours are 9:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday-Saturday and 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday.
