Economists forecast

In 1978 Michigan is expected to record a third consecutive year of growth in personal income, along with a slight rise in employment, substantial state revenue increases, and a virtually unchanged rate of inflation, University of Michigan economists predict.

Prof. Saul H. Hymans and Harold T. Shapiro presented details of their Michigan forecast at the university's 23rd annual conference on the economic outlook.

Their control forecast, which assumes a turn toward more expansive national monetary policy by mid-1978, no major changes in federal tax

policy, and the passage of an energy bill which allows domestic crude oil prices to reach the

world market price by 1980, foresees "a modest but clearly evident slowdown in the state econ-

omy hold about a year from now" barring national policy actions to cut personal income taxes and increase the investment tax credit.

The Michigan forecast is compiled by the U-M Research Seminar in Quantitative Economics, and suggests a rise in state personal income of 11.2 per cent, two percentage points above the Hymans-Shapiro forecast for U.S. personal income and only about one percentage point below the increase estimated for 1977.

The U-M economists said total state employment will continue upward through mid-1979. Increase in non-manufacturing employment "probably represents a healthy redistribution of employment in the state," said the economists.

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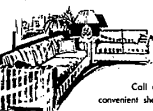
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
