## Pastor Elected To Youth Post

The Rev. Fred W. Baile, pastor of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, 3920 Five Mile Road, Livonia, has recently been elected district youth chairman of the Michigan District of the Lutheran Church -- Missouri Synod.

In his new position, Pastor Baile will be responsible for developing a program for over 20,000 Lutheran young people in Michigan belonging to nearly 400 Lutheran congregations.

Prior to coming to Michigan, Pastor Baile served for several years as district youth leader in Iowa while pastor of a Lutheran Church there. In Michigan, he has served in

youth counseling at the Lutheran High School in Detroit. He also acted as principal of Faith Lutheran School in Livonia.

Later he served as director of the Greater Detroit Council of Lutheran Churches and worked extensively in the area of radio and television in cooperation with the Detroit and Michigan Council of Churches.

Pastor Baile is also a member of the Board of Governors of the University of Wayne State and as a volunteer probation officer for the Livonia courts.

"The approach of churches working with their young people has changed drastically," Pastor Baile claims, "from

providing services within the church for young people to join actively involving young people in the entire scope of the church's operation.

"Young people today are not interested in being trained by their elders to be the church of tomorrow. Youth are the church of today," as Pastor Baile puts it.

Pastor Baile plans to shift the emphasis from providing youth programming on a district level to training adults in local churches to be better equipped to work with their own youth where they are.

Pastor Baile and his wife, Marilyn, have three children: Billy, 6; Bobby, 7, and Ann, 4.
