To celebrate the recent appointment of Archbishop John Dearden to the College of Cardinals, Farmington-Southfield vicariate parish delegates have helped raise a special fund of \$1,250 which will be sent last week to the Inter-Parish Sharing committee to assist struggling inner-city churches.

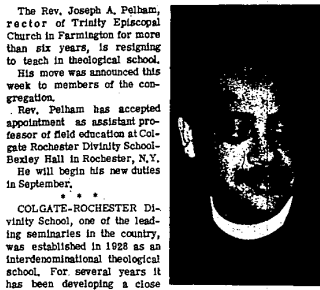
"The people themselves decided this would be an appropriate way to recognize Cardinal Dearden's concerns, which are all of ours," said the Rev. Paschal O'Hagen. "This is a sample of the broader thinking that the vicariate plan is helping bring about, the

passing of purely parochial thought in favor of a true Christian spirit of concern for all."

Rev. O'Hagen has been elected to head the vicariate in its first term of operation.

Increased awareness is being achieved among the vicars of the 25 subdivisions of the eight-county Catholic Archdiocese of Detroit largely as a result of their meetings every other week, as well as their newly structured provisions for regular communications with lay members from surrounding areas. Fr. O'Hagen explained.

# Rev. Pelham Resigns As Rector At Trinity

with the University of Rochester, Rev. Pelham came to Trinity in January 1963.

IN ANNOUNCING his resignation, he stated: "I have become increasingly convinced since 1967, when I spent four months as a pro-

ter fellow at the Episcopal Theological School in Cambridge, Mass., that one of the crucial means by which the church will be renewed lies in the direction of the training which the clergy receive while in seminary and that the quality of that training in turn, hinges upon the degree to which men deepen their sensitivity to the world in which the church ministers.

"The appointment to the faculty of Colgate Rochester Divinity School-Bexley Hall in Rochester, N.Y. He will begin his new duties in September.

COLGATE-ROCHESTER Divinity School, one of the leading seminaries in the country, was established in 1928 as an interdenominational theological school. For several years it has been developing a close relationship with the Catholic St. Bernard's Theological Seminary, and in September 1965, Bexley Hall, a seminary of the Episcopal Church, moved from its former location on the campus of Kenyon College in Gambier, Ohio, to Rochester.

Together, these three schools now comprise the Rochester Center for Theological Studies which is, in turn, affiliated

most in my mind as I consider the need for renewal in the church."

REV. PELHAM is a graduate of the University of Michigan and the Episcopal Theological School.

He served as assistant minister at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Saginaw, as assistant at Mariners' Church, Detroit and as assistant director of the department of Christian social relations of the Diocese of Michigan, and as director of the department of Christian social relations.

He has held a number of church and community posts while serving the Farmington parish. He is a past member of the Oakland County Commission on Economic Opportunity and presently serves on the administrative council of the Oakland County Volunteer Bureau and the Oakland Planning Division of United Community Services.

He also is a member of the standing committee of the Episcopal Diocese, the Board of Examining Chaplains, the diocesan program committee, the college work advisory committee, the board of trustees of the Episcopal Student Foundation at the University of Michigan, and serves as dean of the Grand River Convocation of the Diocese.

He was a deputy to the 1967 general convention of the Episcopal Church in Seattle and will once again represent the diocese at the special general convention to be held in August at South Bend, Ind. He is a former member of the executive council of the Diocese and past national president of the Episcopal Society for Cultural and Racial Unity.

His final services at Trinity Church as rector will be Sept. 7.

# 2 Madonna Administrators Attend Meet

Sister M. Danatha Suchya, president of Madonna College, and Sister Mary Lauriana Grzeszczynski, academic dean, were among 40 college and university administrators participating in an educational media institute June 16 to July 4 at Stephens College, Columbia, Mo.

The purpose of the institute is to give participants information on the application of media systems to the improvement of undergraduate instruction. The institute includes formal lectures, demonstrations, seminars, field trips and laboratory experience. Considerable time is also allotted for group activities and individual consultations.

This is the third summer Stephens College, a four-year college for women, has received grants from the U.S. office of Education for the institute.

What is it like to live out of a suitcase for two months, sleeping in other people's homes, eating their food, and traveling 700 to 800 miles a week?

"Great! But we love it!" says Juney Cheryl Toombs of the Gospelers Trio from Gulf-Coast Bible College in Houston, Texas.

Cheryl is one of four girls representing this southwestern college of the Church of God in a seven-day tour this summer. They will appear in a sacred concert here at the Riverside Park Church of God, Plymouth and Newburg, at 7:30 p.m. Thursday evening, July 10.

"We were placed together after an audition last October," said Cheryl. "I had begun choosing our music right away. After six months of prayer and practice we sang for a panel of judges to determine our ability. After that it was just a matter of more practice, week-end concerts, and getting our school work done before it was time to go."

DURING their eight-week tour, the girls will give one concert each evening and two on Sunday in towns from Texas to Michigan, with occasional days off to rest and relax. They receive no pay for their summer's work except a small scholarship granted by the college. Each of the four girls plans to enter some form of Christian ministry, and considers her summer service part of her "training to be evangelists of our heritage," as the school motto suggests.

The public is invited to attend their concert here. "We love people," exclaimed Cheryl, "and hope to bless the lives of everyone we meet."

# Witnesses Attend Meet

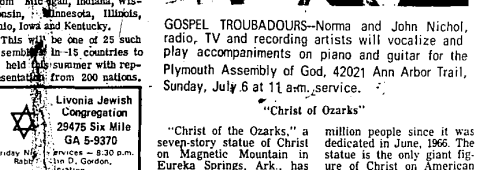
