Announce Prizes For Queen

A list of prizes was announced this week for the queen and two runners up in the 1969 Farmington Founders Festival beauty competition.

The queen will receive, in addition to her crown and bouquet of roses, an engraved sterling bowl, \$100 cash, an adult Federal's claim school certificate, and a wardrobe.

FIRST runnerup will receive \$50 cash and an engraved sterling bowl and second runnerup will receive \$25 cash and the engraved bowl.

Each contestant will receive a personal favor and the 10 finalists will be given an engraved charm.

To enter, contestants must be

between 17-22 years old, never have been married, and a resident of Farmington since July 1, 1968.

Final judging will be held July 24. Deadline for submitting entries is July 16.

Ten Tons Of Steak Ordered For Scouts

When over 40,000 Boy Scouts and leaders gather in Farragut State Park, Idaho, next week for the scoutings' National Jamboree, it's going to take over one million cans, jars and packages of food to feed them.

Over 20,000 pounds of steak have been ordered to feed the throng, eight million paper cups and plates and 200 tons of charcoal.

That's a lot of groceries. A daily newspaper will go into publication during the Jamboree. About 70,000 editions are expected to be distributed each day.

Reports will be made on such daily activities of the Jamboree as hikes in the mountains, waterfront doings, skill demonstrations, evening campfires, hunter safety instruction and meals cooked over charcoal grills.

President Nixon is expected to meet the Scouts for good fellowship and fun over the closing campfire.

A total of 111 Scouts, Explorers and adult leaders from the Clinton Valley Council will attend the festivities, including

the 85-piece marching band of Troop 329 of Nardin Park, Methodist Church, Farmington.

The band is "travelling west by automobile caravans and will play at several local spots along the way.

Leaders of the Troop band are Farmington residents George A. Fletcher of 7827 Greythorne, Lindsay Chalmers of 2937 Pipers Lane, Frank Denmore of 2007 Eastfield and James A. Iarsant of 2934 Giacante.
