City Police Vehicles Get Air Conditioners

Farmington city policemen will be riding in air conditioned police cars soon. Farmington township policemen have been riding in air conditioned squad cars for some time but as have a number of neighboring police departments.

In addition, the city plans to buy another air conditioner for the new ambulance vehicle. Since the ambulance is being financed through a federal grant, the city's share for the fifth air conditioning unit will be only \$114.

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Only Four Days Left Before Queen Deadline

There are only four days left to enter the 1969 Farmington Founders Festival queen competition.

Deadline for entries is Wednesday, July 16. Preliminary trials will be held July 22 and final judging on July 24, opening day of the festival.

To enter, girls must be between 17-22 years old, never have been married, and a resident of Farmington since July 1, 1968.

Girls will be judged on appearance, poise and personality.

THE QUEEN will reign during the three days of the festival, July 24, 25, 26, and will represent the Farmington Board of Commerce at civic functions throughout the year.

The queen will receive her crown, a bouquet of roses, \$100 cash, an engraved sterling bowl, a wardrobe and an adult Federal's charm school certificate.

First runner-up will receive \$50 cash and an engraved bowl and second runner-up will get \$25 cash and an engraved bowl. Each contestant will receive a personal favor and the 10 finalists will be given engraved charms.

Merchants wishing to sponsor a contestant may do so by submitting a \$25 fee to the Board of Commerce. Information on sponsorship can be obtained by Barb Benya at 476-2590.

THE FESTIVAL itself is 12 days away and initial reports indicate it will be bigger than ever.

Features for all three days include helicopter rides, carnival rides, concession booths and sidewalk sales. Other features will be a number of dinners such as the Elks or roast, three-course dinner and chicken barbecue plus the appearance of NBD's mobile money machine all day Saturday.

A complete report on festival activities is forthcoming in two special editions to be published by the Farmington Enterprise & Observer on July 19 and 23.

July 24, will be highlighted by final judging in the queen's contest and announcement of the winners.

In addition to the beauty pageant, there will be a special concert Thursday night in the downtown center by the Omega Singers. Another Thursday night attraction will be a string orchestra sponsored by the White Shrine in the Masonic Temple.
