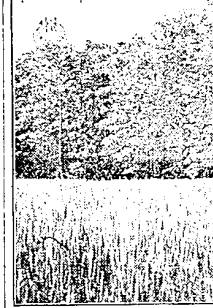
State Must Have Bigger Acreage and Forty Million Bushel Crop in 1918.

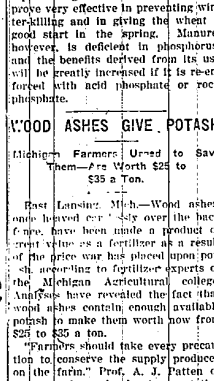
Prepare Wheat Land Early. It requires from four to six weeks to put land in the best condition for barley or oat stubble ground dries quickly, and should be plowed and fitted as soon as possible.

WOOD ASHES GIVE POTASH Michigan Farmers Urged to Save Them—Are Worth \$25 to \$35 a Ton.

East Lansing, Mich.—Wood ashes, once beloved and used over the back fence, have been made a product of great value as a fertilizer as a result of the price war that has placed upon potash a surcharge in fertilizer exports of the Michigan Agricultural college.

Prof. A. J. Patten of the experimental chemistry station declares: "Wood ashes have a high value on account of the potash they contain. Ashes from hard wood contain, when dry, from 5 to 7 per cent of potash and are worth from \$25 to \$35 per ton in other words it would require \$25 to \$35 to purchase as much potash in the form of commercial fertilizers as is contained in one ton of average hard wood ashes.
