DISBROW DEFENDS
TITLE AT STATE FAIRProgram of Speed Events For Ford
Racers on Closing Day

At a meeting of automobile racing enthusiasts at Chicago last fall Louis Disbrow, America's foremost circular dirt track speed "pilot," announced that after a year's absence from the racing arena he would defend his title against any driver in the country and backed up his statement with a side bet of \$1,000 on the outcome of the race. George W. Dickinson, of G. W. Dickinson's of the Michigan State Fair, who attended the meeting, promptly took the famous driver at his word and arranged a race meet during the Michigan State Fair at Detroit from August 31 to September 9.

All of the races will be under the auspices of the International Motor Contest association, and will be officially timed for records. Thousand of dollars in prizes will be awarded drivers participating in the event, with a feature by a large entry list. Aside from the money prizes the State Fair will put up a trophy for the Interstate event in which drivers representing various states will compete.

Unusual interest attaches to the special card of Ford racing events on the last day of the Fair. Inquiries have been received from scores of drivers regarding this year's race giving ample information of entries from all parts of the country. The Ford racing at the State Fair are becoming a classic and are yearly attracting more drivers of the lighter cars throughout the country. Rich purses are offered winners aside from trophies which are awarded annually to slightly the leaders in the various light car classes during the year.

IMPROVEMENTS AT STATE FAIR

Thousands of Dollars in New Lighting
System and Walks For Convenience of Visitors.

Thousands of dollars have been expended in improvements at the Michigan State Fair this year, and visitors to the annual exposition at Detroit from August 31 to September 9, will be greeted by a number of betterments on the grounds and in the buildings.

The entire lighting arrangement of the State Fair has been reconstructed providing a decided improvement in the illumination of all exposition buildings and grounds. The lighting system on the grounds will be topped by an electric sign announcing the exhibit it contains.

The boulevard lighting system which was introduced last year has been considerably extended until now there are over 100 lights on the grounds.

Several miles of concrete sidewalks were laid during the summer and over a mile of roadway has been constructed.

Brush Up the House Cat
and Groom the Canary
for State Fair Prize

Every dog has his day, and so will every animal at the Michigan State Fair at Detroit from August 31 to September 9, where \$300 in awards are offered to prize winning felines in the Cat show, a new feature of the Pet Stock Department.

There will be classes for all kinds of cats, long-haired cats, short-haired cats, neuter, black, brown, white and tortoise shell cats. Cats with green eyes, gray eyes and blue eyes. The kitten class is open to cats under one year of age, and the adult class. The cat class is open to all cats and kittens over five months. If any feline is wrongly classified he is no longer a contender for prize honors. Stacey Tubb cannot make it own designation this responsibility will rest on the owner.

Another feature of the Pet Stock Department is the class for cage birds. This class offers prizes aggregating \$200 for the finest specimens of canary birds, Goldfinches, Bulfinches, Linnets, Titmouses, Doves, Quail and wild birds.
