CONTROL PEACH LEAF CURL Caused by Fungous Discase Which Produces Reddish Colored Dis-tortion—Spray in Winter.

The carling of the leaves of peach trees is jotten caused by a fungous disease called leaf curl. This tungus attacks the tissue of the leaf, pro-duces a reddish colored distortion and duces a reddish colored distortion and distroys the tenf as a starch-produc-ing orgap. Because of the loss of this foliage the true is depleted in thiality and the setting of builds for next year's errop greatly reduced. The fungues becomes netive very early in spring, even before the mid-die of March which the spring opens early and warm. It attacks the swell-ing build and gets into the tisskes be-fore the leaf is unfolded. Therefore
