"We learn more than we give," says James Dudley, of Plymouth, one of 13 chaplaincy students in a clinical pastoral training program at the University of Michigan Hospital this summer.

Michigan Bank reported total assets of \$629 million on June 30, as opposed to \$570 million one year ago. Total deposits increased \$38 million, to a high of \$568 million. Loans increased approximately \$40 million over the last 12-month period.

Total capital accounts increased \$5.1 million, to a high of \$31.6 million, as a result of an additional sale of preferred stock, capital notes, and a 75 per cent retention of earnings.

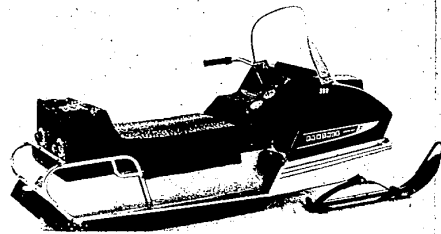
White Michigan Bank does not report mid-year earnings due to year-end tax adjustments.

Stanford C. Stoddard, the bank's President, indicated that the first six months of 1969 were by far the most profitable period in the bank's history.

Stoddard added that the bank was in full accord with the Federal Reserve's policy of restricting credit to reduce the inflationary cycle. "While we are not saying no to established customers, we are restricting our loans to new ventures," according to Stoddard.

Michigan Bank, National Association now operates 27 offices in the tri-county area and plans to open several new offices between now and year-end. The bank ranks number 100 out of the 1,500 insured commercial banks in the United States.
