Baseball will receive prime attention during the 1969 Farmington Founders Festival.

A slow-pitch elimination tournament, old-timers hardball game, minor and major league all star games, and a girls softball game will give the festival a distinct flavor of our national pastime.

THE SLOWPITCH elimination tournament will begin Friday, July 25, at 6 p.m. on the City Park and Knights of Columbus ball diamonds.

The slowpitch championship elimination will continue on Saturday starting at 7 p.m. on the K of C field.

Little Leaguers will stage their two all-star contests on Saturday, July 26. All youngsters will be from the South Farmington Baseball for Boys teams.

The minor league all-star tilt is scheduled for 3 p.m. at the

city park to be followed by the major league contest starting at 7 p.m.

AFTER THE little leaguers clear the field, the diamonds will be taken over by the girls for the girls softball game beginning at 8:30 p.m., also in city park.

Friday night, starting at 6 p.m., the old-timers will get together for their annual game and reunion at the Farmington Senior High ball park across from the Elks Lodge on Orchard Lake Rd.

This year's final production will be "Pillow Talk" which will be presented during the festival on July 25, 26 at 8 p.m. in the Clarenceville High School auditorium.
