Sealed bids for the purchase of the above bonds will be received by the undersigned at 3827 Cotwold Road, in the Village of Quakertown, Michigan (post office: Farmington, Michigan 48024), until 8 p.m., Eastern Standard Time, on Monday, the 4th day of August, 1969, at which time and place said bids will be publicly opened and read.

Said bonds will be coupon bonds of the denomination of \$1,000.00 each, numbered consecutively in direct order of maturity from 1 to 34, both inclusive, will be dated June 1, 1969, and will mature serially without option of prior redemption as follows:

- \$4,000.00 August 1, 1969;
- \$4,000.00 August 1, 1970;
- \$4,000.00 August 1, 1971;
- \$4,000.00 August 1, 1972;
- \$4,000.00 August 1, 1973;
- \$4,000.00 August 1, 1974;
- \$4,000.00 August 1, 1975;
- \$4,000.00 August 1, 1976;
- \$4,000.00 August 1 of each of years 1977 and 1978.

Said bonds will bear interest from their date at a rate of three per cent exceeding five and one-half per cent (5 1/2%) per annum, expressed in multiples of 1/8% at 120% of 1% on any combination thereof. Said interest will be payable on August 1, 1969, and semi-annually thereafter on February 1 and August 1 of each year. The interest rate on any one bond shall be at one rate only and shall be represented by only one coupon for each coupon period and all bonds maturing in the same year shall carry the same interest rate. None of said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum which is less than 50% of the rate borne by any other bonds of this issue.

Both principal and interest will be payable at a bank or trust company qualified to act as paying agent under Michigan as federal statute, to be designated by the original purchaser of the bonds, and subject to the approval of the Village. Accrued interest to date of delivery of such bonds may be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery.

For the purpose of awarding the bonds, the interest cost of each bid will be computed by date maturity, at the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds from September 1, 1969, to their maturity, and deducting therefrom any premium. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above computation results in the lowest interest cost to the Village. No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the bonds herein offered, or at a price less than their par value will be considered.

Said bonds are issued in anticipation of the collection of a like amount of deferred installments of special assessments on Special Assessment Roll No. 1 of the Village for the purpose of paying a part of the cost of street improvements in said special assessment district, and in addition to the special assessments, will pledge the full faith and credit of the Village for their payment.

A certified or cashier's check in the amount of \$1,000.00, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company, payable to the order of the Village of Quakertown, must accompany each bid as a guaranty of good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such bid is accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the bonds. No interest will be allowed on the good faith checks and checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned promptly to each bidder's representative or by registered mail.

Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified opinion of Miller, Cressfield, Padgett and Stone, attorneys of Detroit, Michigan, approving the legality of the bonds, which opinion will be furnished, without expense to the purchaser of the bonds prior to the delivery thereof and will be printed on each bond. There will also be furnished to the purchaser, as indicated, dated as the date of delivery of and payment for the bonds, including a statement that there is no litigation pending or, to the knowledge of the signers thereof, threatened, affecting the validity of the bonds. The Village shall furnish bonds ready for execution at its expense. Bonds will be delivered without expense to the purchaser at Detroit, Michigan.

The right is reserved to reject any or all bids.

# Township Trees Now On Sale

The Farmington Township Beautification Committee is sponsoring a tree planting program for township residents. Sale of the trees will begin during the Farmington Founders Festival. Order blanks may be obtained during the festival at the Township Beautification booth located in the Denery Shopping Center.


THE TREES available through the program are well-branched, small trees with a trunk diameter of 1 1/4 to 1 3/4 inches. Cost will be under \$25.

If planted by the township on public right of way, the cost has been set at \$22 per tree. If planted by the township on private property, the cost is \$25. The cost is \$18 if the homeowner does his own planting.

The trees are bare-rooted specimens and are guaranteed by the Township for one year. Any that die will be replaced.

This is an excellent opportunity for home owners to add beauty to their grounds and beautify the entire township, says Don J. Gordon of the Beautification Committee.
