

Train Married Or Single Men As Full Time Catholic Deacons

The ancient order of permanent deacon is being reinstated in the Catholic Church and two-year training programs are about to start at Orchard Lake Seminary and in Detroit at Sacred Heart Seminary.

With little warning and no precedent, American centers for training both married and single men for this ministry are also getting underway in Iowa, Minnesota, and the Washington-Baltimore area, according to the Rev. Anthony Kosik, director of the Orchard Lake program.

"We are interested in full time training for highly professional deacons who will primarily serve the church on a full time paid basis," states Rev. Kosik.

"Training for part-time deacons seems to be the plan for the initial work of the program, but there is no reason why some full time men could not come from their program also."

SCREENING of applicants for classes to start Monday, Sept. 8 is now going on and interested men are invited to visit the schools with their families.

servant. His task is not to replace the priest, but rather to be a glorified lay apostle. His life is specifically consecrated to the service of the church. Some of the greatest figures of New Testament times were deacons, St. Francis of Assisi, for one," the statement continued.

Minimum age of 35 is now required of candidates for ordination to the permanent diaconate but training may be started before that age and the school's director urges interested married or single men to call or write to discuss their situation.

COLLEGE GRADUATION or equivalent training and experience, good health and emotional stability, as well as evidence of church membership and personal recommendation of a pastor or other priest, are the chief requirements for admission.

Normally, the candidate would enter training following recommendation of his bishop, but individuals may apply for training with the intention of being accepted by a bishop at a later time.

Classroom work is planned for 12 hours a week, allowing time for practical experience in parish work as well as outside study.

"Because of the great differences among candidates, each man's courses will have to be arranged on a highly individual basis," Rev. Kosik states.

Living accommodations are available on campus for some single men who married men and their families are being referred to rental homes and apartments in the area for their two-year training period.

The American Bible Society in New York has announced publication of 50 thousand copies of the New Testament in celebration of the YMCA's 125th birthday. Free gift copies will be placed in every YMCA room across the country.

The special anniversary edition is Today's English Version (TEV) or "Good News for Modern Man," an ABS translation hailed by many as the most understandable scripture translation ever published.

Unlike many hotel room Bibles, the YMCA edition of the TEV carries an inscription inviting the reader to take the book with him when he checks out. Bibles placed in hotels and motels often are marked: "Please do not remove from this room."

THE 600-PAGE paperback

contains some 200 line drawings by Swiss illustrator Annie Vallotton. Its jacket design is a collage of masterheads from the world's leading newspapers.

Since Today's English Version was first published in 1968, more than 16 million copies have been sold or distributed, and has been the world's best seller for two successive years.
