

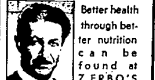
Parents Have Self Aid Plans

Ever since Cleopatra has had a big hand in shaping the destinies of men and nations, she has been a fascinating empress and destroying them. Such a woman was Cleopatra, which was the name of all Egyptian queens during the Ptolemaic Dynasty, but this Cleopatra was the one who really made a name for herself. She was Antioch, daughter of Ptolemy XII, born in 68 B.C. She became queen when she was 17. Her brother the Pharaoh had married her because he was weak. Caesar was assassinated, and Cleopatra fled to Rome. She became a conquest of Egypt, but Caesar became so fascinated by her charms that he divorced her Pharaoh and replaced him with Cleopatra as Queen. When Caesar was assassinated, his military successor, and Roman Emperor, Octavian required them both to die. Antony killed himself and Cleopatra followed him, allowing herself to be bitten by a deadly asp on August 13, 30 B.C. With her death, the Ptolemaic Dynasty ended.
