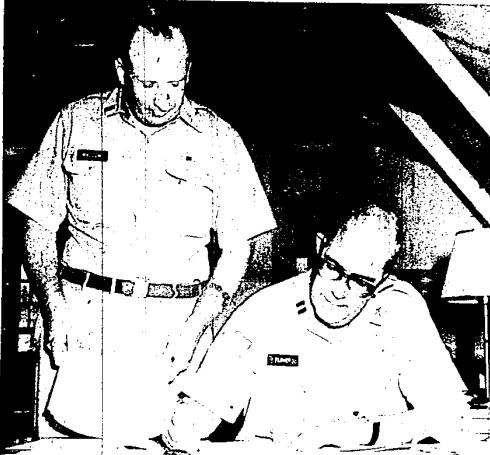

Omni Spectra 9-Month Sales, Net Show Dip

FARMINGTON
Omni Spectra, Inc., a space age electronics firm, reported slightly reduced sales and earnings for the nine months ended June 30 compared to the same period a year ago.
President John H. Bryant added, however, that third quarter sales and earnings were higher than in the second quarter, with sales up 22 per cent and earnings 68 per cent.
OMNI SPECTRA reported sales of \$1,444,340 for the three months ended June 30 compared to \$1,528,972 in the same quarter of 1968.
Net earnings for the quarter were \$110,640 or 14 cents a share compared to \$125,462 or 17 cents a share for the third quarter last year.
Sales for the nine months ended June 30 were \$3,746,656, down from the \$4,140,500 for the same period in the previous year.
Net earnings were \$260,837 or 33 cents a share, down from the total of \$382,662 or 56 cents a share in the same period last year.
BRYANT REPORTED two major internal developments last year.

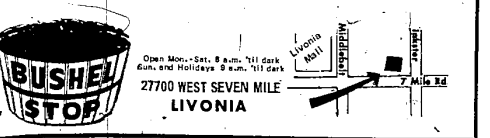

Rep. McDonald Shifts Residence To Farmington

WASHINGTON
Jack McDonald, the Republican Congressman from the 19th District which includes Farmington, Livonia and Redford, has moved to Farmington Township.
McDonald confirmed a report that he had purchased a home in Oakland County and has moved his legal residence from Livonia to Farmington.
The congressman said that he had purchased a house built in 1835 and located on the Bedford Inn property. The McDonalds have built a home in Falls Church, Va., but the congressman says he spends "a couple of weekends a month in the district."
THE FARMINGTON Township clerk's office said that McDonald had requested the necessary forms for a voter registration, but had not filed them as of Wednesday.
McDonald was supervisor of Redford Township when he was first elected to Congress in 1966. Early in 1969 he established a legal and voting residence at his mother's home in Livonia.
There's a political significance to the move with the almost certain possibility of a re-drawing of the congressional district lines following the 1970 census.
McDONALD AGREES that re-districting is possible and sees that both the 19th and 18th (in eastern Oakland County) as "shrinking in size" because of their tremendous growth in population. Some of these districts will probably be added to existing Detroit districts to make up for the lack of population growth in Detroit," he said.
The congressman said that he would seek re-election to a third term in 1970 while denying reports that he is eyeing a possible GOP candidacy to oppose Democratic Sen. Philip Hart.
"I am not a candidate for the Senate, I don't expect to be, and I won't be," he said.
