The Orchard Lake Division winter schedule will go into effect on the above date, and important changes will be made in the time tables:

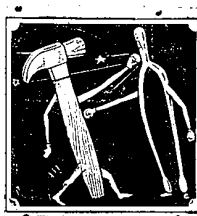

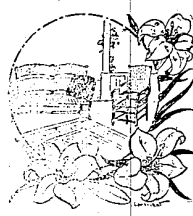
