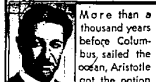
After you've decided where they go, you can remove the old hooks and nails and patch the holes with spackle or patching plaster.

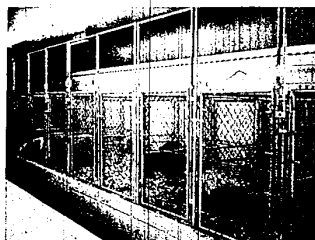
