

Top riders from 4 nations compete in show

Top amateur and professional riders from four nations compete for ribbons, trophies and \$65,000 in prize money during almost three weeks of horse shows which ended Sunday at the Bloomfield Open Hunt Club.

Hundreds of riders and more than 500 horses vied for honors in the Detroit Dressage Show, the Motor City Horse Show and the Detroit Horse Show. The shows, considered the top outdoor equestrian events in the nation, spanned 10 days and involved a total of 194 events staged in three separate rings at the sprawling 72-acre club.

An estimated 50,000 spectators watched the dawn-to-dusk competition which attracted horses and riders from throughout the United States and Canada, and included Japan's Olympic Equestrian Jumping Team and (Luisa Mendez, who represented the Guatemalan Olympic Equestrian Jumping Team.

Competition was dominated by a handful of standard riders and horses.

Mr. DeMunnor, ridden by Rodney Jenkins, a disciplined professional from Or-

ange, Va., out-distanced all competitors in hunting and jumping events, galloping off with top honors in the \$10,000 North American Open Junior Classic at the Detroit Horse Show, as well as the Motor City Open Junior Championship. Mr. DeMunnor is owned by E.T. Rumberger of Maryland, Fla.

Junior exhibitors at the Motor City and Detroit Shows were paced by Scott Netherlander of Birmingham. The 18-year-old was named Grand Junior Champion, taking blue ribbons in hunter, jumper and equitation events, and the Bloomfield Open Hunt High Score Trophy for All Around Excellence in Horsemanship.

To climax his wins, Netherlander rode Such A Star, ridden by Tip Top Farms of Kentucky. The horse was honored as Motor City Hunter Champion of Champions.

In the \$1,500 North American Junior Amateur Hunter Classic, won by Quet Please, ridden by Maria Buehler of Crutman Farm in Santa Barbara, Such A Star, with Netherlander up, placed third.

First, second and third places in the \$1,500 North American Hunter Classic, final event of the Detroit Horse Show Sunday, went to three horses ridden by Jenkins. They were: Touch the Sun, owned by Gail Sullivan of Birmingham, 10; Azusa, owned by Crutman Farm and San Felipe, owned by Morton Turfow of Puerto Rico.

Jenkins, who is the only rider to twice win the President's Cup at the Washington International Horse Show, placed in the top three slots in over 45 hunter events and won 20 jumper events at the Motor City and Detroit Horse shows. He earned a score of championships and reserves, and dozens of trophies.

Netherlander, in the junior division, placed high in some 25 hunter and jumper competitions, and made top scores in several equitation sections.

The youthful rider, who will probably set his sights on Olympic competition in 1980, took championships and trophies in every category, including the Auer Family Challenge Trophy for Junior Hunters, Reserve Junior Jumper Championship for the Blue Bonnet Challenge Trophy, Working Hunter Champion for Junior Hunters, 16 Hands and Over, and the Oakland University Combined Events Trophy. Other Junior riders with impressive records in the two shows included Polly Howard.

NOTICE OF MEETING TO HEAR OBJECTIONS TO APPOINTMENT OF COST OF ABOVE INTRA-COUNTY DRAIN

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the cost of the Ten Mile-Rouge Sanitary Drain, to be located in the City of Farmington Hills, has been tentatively apportioned as follows, to wit:

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, that the Drainage Board for the Ten Mile-Rouge Sanitary Drain, will meet at 10:00 o'clock A.M., Eastern Daylight Time, on Wednesday, the 24th day of July, 1976, in the office of the Oakland County Drain Commissioner, Public Works Building, 1 Public Works Drive, Pontiac, Michigan, for the purpose of hearing any objections to the said apportionment.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, that the plans, specifications and estimate of cost of said Ten Mile-Rouge Sanitary Drain and also, a description of the area to be served thereby are on file in the office of the Oakland County Drain Commissioner, Public Works Building, 1 Public Works Drive, Pontiac, Michigan. The said estimated cost is \$5,000.00, but the apportionment percentage as finally established by the Drainage Board shall apply to the actual cost of said drain when finally completed.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, that at said hearing any public corporation to be assessed shall have the right to be heard.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, that after consideration of all objections to the apportionment the Drainage Board shall determine whether the apportionment fairly reflects the benefits to accrue to the public corporation and the extent to which the public corporation contributes to the conditions which make the drain necessary. If the Drainage Board determines that the apportionment is equitable it will enter a Final Order of Apportionment confirming the apportionment. Section 483 of Act No. 40, Public Acts of Michigan, 1966, as amended, provides that the Final Order of Apportionment shall not be subject to attack in any court, except by proceedings in certiorari brought within 30 days after the order is filed in the office of the Oakland County Drain Commissioner, the Chairman of the Drainage Board for the Ten Mile-Rouge Sanitary Drain, and that if said proceedings shall be brought within said 30-day period the legality of the assessments for the drain shall not thereafter be questioned in any suit at law or in equity, either on jurisdictional or nonjurisdictional grounds.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, that if the Drainage Board enters the Final Order of Apportionment a special assessment roll assessing the estimated cost of the drain against the public corporation in accordance with the confirmed apportionment will be prepared and presented to the Drainage Board for approval. The Drainage Board then intends to issue bonds of the Ten Mile-Rouge Sanitary Drainage District in anticipation of the collection of installments of said assessment and the interest thereon. The public corporation assessed is obligated to levy sufficient taxes to pay the assessment installments and interest as the same become due unless there has been set aside moneys sufficient therefor.
