

Women introduce art to kids

Nearly 22,000 children in 200 Detroit and suburban elementary schools have become better acquainted with famous works of art this year through the efforts of 50 members of the Founders Society of the Detroit Institute of Art.

The society's art to the schools committee, to be headed for the coming year by Mrs. Robert Miller of Birmingham, recently opened up a decade of activity with a luncheon in the home of Mrs. David Levin of Southfield.

The volunteers visit elementary schools, speaking on a variety of art subjects and taking along reproductions of the works of art for children to see and touch.

Patricia Burnett given MSU award

Patricia Hill Burnett, leader in the women's movement, received Michigan State University's State Family Living Silver Salute Award for excellence in community leadership.

The award, sponsored by Family Living Education of the MSU Cooperative Extension Service, was presented during the Extension's College Week. Gov. William Milliken presented an engraved silver tray to Mrs. Burnett.

The honoree is active in many organizations. She has been secretary for the executive board of the Michigan Women's Commission, a commissioner for the Detroit House of Corrections, Civic Searchlight and Urban Alliance, board member, NAACP women's board member, precinct delegate and treasurer for the First Congressional District Republican Party, a member of the Republican State Central Committee, secretary of the Republican Ways and Means Committee, a member of ZONTA and the Women's Economic Club of Detroit.

She was past chairperson of international affairs for the National Organization for Women (N.O.W.) and served as their delegate to the International Women's Year United Nations Tribune in Mexico City. She was instrumental in starting 20 N.O.W. international affiliates and served as the first president of the Michigan chapter.

In addition, Mrs. Burnett is an accomplished and renowned artist. She is a professional portrait painter and sculptor and the first woman to have a studio in the Scab Club in Detroit.

In honor of the bicentennial she has been commissioned to do portraits of

famous women, including Betty Ford, Mario Thomas, Gloria Steinem, Germaine Greer and Rosa Parks. Mrs. Burnett is recognized for her early radio work and continued participation in the media as a spokesperson to improve the welfare of women in Wayne County and the state. She is the wife of a corporation president and has four children.
