# Archbishop to join liturgy

The Apostolic Delegate to the United States will lead a special bi-centennial year religious celebration Sunday, July 11, at the Orchard Lake Schools in West Bloomfield Township.

Archbishop Jean Jakez of Washington will be the main celebrant at an outdoor eucharistic liturgy at 3 p.m. in front of the Shrine Chapel of Our Lady of Orchard Lake on the Schools' campus. Several Detroit-area priests will concelebrate. Thousands of faithful from the vicinity are expected to attend the event which will be concluded with a procession to the Marian Grotto right after the Mass.

According to Very Rev. Walter J. Zambra, President Rector of the Schools, the entire day is one of "thanksgiving to God for America's treasured freedom and liberty that she has enjoyed for these 200 years." Archbishop Jakez, 64, has served as the U.S. Apostolic Delegate since 1973. Ordained in Brussels in 1934, he has served in a variety of pastoral positions including that of chaplain of the Congolese Forces in the Belgian Congo.

## Moral perspectives Our Independence: still in the making

It looked easy enough. Name as many signers of the Declaration of Independence as you can and list the facts presented as evidence for the revolutionary act. But even sharing information did not raise the group response to a passing mark. Was this an unusual failure? I suspect not, but it would be satisfying to learn that it was.

Perhaps, though, the unique contribution of the Declaration of Independence does not lie in its analysis of what was, nor in knowing who made it. Rather, the gift our founding fathers gave us was an outline of that radical vision for a nation of people that would be a nurture of equality and justice for all.

The truths that our forefathers claimed were self-evident have been elusive in our history, and stand more as a goal for us than an acknowledged experience. And even when these truths have been lifted up as goals, the response has not always been wholly supportive.

By adding qualifications and setting restrictions, we have used such lines as "all men are created equal" or "governments derive their just power from the consent of the governed" to do something less than inherently possible.

here as slaves and then freed to be servants and second-class citizens, the experiences of native Americans who were deceived, subjugated and then neglected—there are enough facts to be submitted to us that make the Declaration an unfinished act.
