## 'Oldies' on film

This month, Channel 56 has "Oldies but Goodies" for the Saturday night movie series "Film Festival."

"Film Festival '76" presents two Alec Guinness movies back-to-back the following Saturday at 9 p.m. "Last Holiday" (1950) is the subtle, witty story of a lonely salesman who takes a final fling when he has a fatal and incurable disease. In "To Paris With Love" (1955), a savorie-faire and the spirit of adventure take a widower and his son to Paris to "chercher les femmes."

"A Sense of Loss" (July 24, 9 p.m.) is a not so old (1972) but definitely different film. It's the story of the Irish Civil

War told in the human terms of suffering and loss of loved ones caused by terrorism and bombing. The film features interviews with Bernadette Devlin, Rep. Ian Paisley, a British commander and an IRA freedom fighter. Double-dip comedy is the topping on this month's movie schedule (July 31, 9 p.m.) starting with the French film Caesar and Rosalie (1972). It's a three-way love affair among the one who went away, the girl left behind and her new lover. Next week, Ray Milland, Henry Schneider and Sean Frey star in "The Man in the White Suit" (1951) stars Alec Guinness vs. Big Business when he invents a fabric that will last forever.

## 3 teachers featured in 'The Apple Tree'

She is directing and directing high school theater she has performed in a variety of musicals and straight shows while continuing her graduate studies at U of D. Her next call is for seven costume changes: "Shades of Eve, An Oriental Princess, and Passionella a star-struck Cinderella."

"The Apple Tree" opened July 9. It will run for the next two weekends from Wednesday to Sunday through July 25. Tickets can be reserved at the box office located in the theatre at 16500 Huron in Highland Park, Michigan.
