Catholics Get New Funeral Guidelines

New funeral guidelines, less rigid than those of the past, have been approved by John Cardinal Dearden for the Archdiocese of Detroit on recommendation of the 25 Archdiocesan Vicars. Hereafter every family requesting the services of its parish priest on the occasion of a death is to be given a funeral service, except in extremely rare instances. In the past, Catholics who for long had neglected to practice their faith, non-Catholic members of Catholic families, some suicides, and Catholics who married invalidly sometimes were refused a service or else given only a greatly curtailed one.

Under the new guidelines, the general practice will be to provide a three-part service for all; a wake service, either recital of the rosary or a scriptural rite—preceding the funeral day, a funeral Mass, or else a rite in the funeral home, preceding the burial, and rites in the cemetery.

Under the guidelines, members of any household, whether they are Catholics or not, may be interred in a Catholic cemetery in a family plot in which Catholic family members are buried or will be buried. If a non-Catholic cemetery is selected for such persons, priests may conduct graveside services in it.

Ministers of other faiths may conduct appropriate services for their dead in Catholic cemeteries.

The theological considerations involved in the new guidelines hinge on the fact that the Catholic funeral liturgy is not only for the dead but also for the living; it is particularly a moment of communion in which the God speaks to the living the message of the resurrection and of the eternal life to come.

Because of this, the Vicars recommended that persons who might not have the strict qualifications for a Christian burial be accorded services as a means of bringing to the family and friends the consolation of Christ, an opportunity to pray for the dead, and instructions in the Gospel message of the communion of saints, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting.

The aim was to have the guidelines reflect the spirit of the Vatican Council as well as the thinking of the recent Archdiocesan Synod—a general meeting of the minds of the 1,500,000 Catholics in the Archdiocese.
