All's not happy in the Greater Livonia Class A baseball league.
The word is circulating around Ford Field that there may not be any circuit for the young adults next season.
If that happens, it would be a tragedy.

It segms that the Hubert Realty team has been charged by Manager Bill Mikel of Red-ford Township with violating the "residence rule" which prescribes that eight hometown boys must appear on a team's roster.

That means Hubert must carry eight Livonians, there must be eight from Redford Township on Mikel's team . eight on the Plymouth K.C. team[from Plymouth, etc.

These aren't just the local rules, but are the regulations of the American Baseball Congress tournament to which the Livonia League champs aspires to advance in the forthcoming weeks. Two years ago Redford was the national runnerup in the ABC world series at Battle Creek.

"If there's an eligibility rule, let's abide by it," says Mikel.

SINCE THE LEAGUE is sponsored by the Livonia Recreation department, Mikels claims he's been "shoved around" to the point he probably won't field a team next season, and a couple of other managers are feeling the same way.

What Mikel claims is that when teams had to solidify their rosters back on May 12, Hubert had only six bonafide Livonians.

Two others were listed as Livonians via the extended rule which permits one to work for somebody in the city of question, or merely arrange a working agreement.

"That part would have been okay," claims Mikel, "except one of the boys was attending college in Florida as late as May 27 and another was attending college in Kalamazoo and playing on the Western Michigan team ... and he wasn't through there until early in June.

"So, something has to smell wrong. It's creating a situation whereby next year somebody could sign up six or seven such outsiders.

"We don't need that. I think our taxpayers, who help foot the program, have a reason to complain. We certainly have enough great players around here ... and we can take pride in them ... without having to get men from other communities."

Mikel says that his protests have fallen on deaf ears.

"They tell me to get out on the field and win."

Not too long ago one team in the league (Village Rambler) had to forfeit a game for using an ineligible player. Well, if that holds true for one team, why not for all teams?"

MANAGER RON HELLIER of Hubert insists there's nothing wrong with his roster . . that Hubert hasn't violated any rules.

But Mikel, a pillar in amateur baseball in these parts for many years, isn't happy.
