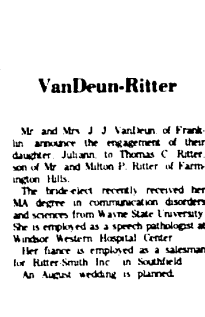
They plan to be married in June.
