The groom's brother, James Zawacki, was best man. Mike Duckett, Robert Pump and Jim Hammer served with the room.


The bride is a 1974 graduate of Harrison High School and a former employee of the W. T. Andrew Co. of Highland Park.

The couple took their wedding trip in the East and will reside in Norfolk, Va.




