Back when Bob Wall was in the guild, the group performed a series of one-act plays in Jack Wilcox's lower garden.

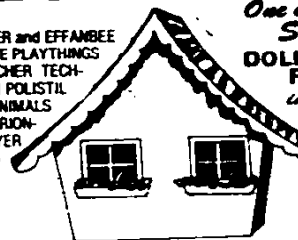
The sound system thwarted attempts to present plays from the bandstand. It just didn't work out. One year they tried pantomime and another time readings.
