Hey kids, rid yourself of back to school blues

To counteract the end of the summer and the back to school blues, the Farmington Community Library is offering a large roster of programs.

The Farmington Hills branch is located at 32737 Twelve Mile and the Farmington branch is at 23500 Liberty. Registration for the programs is Sept. 13 from 9-11 a.m.

Programs at the Farmington Hills branch are for preschoolers through sixth grade.

ONE, TWO, WHAT'S IN THE SHOE? is a 30-minute program of stories, songs, dramas and puppets for preschoolers, three to five, four and five. Tuesdays, 9:30-10 a.m., Sept. 28-Nov. 2, ages three and four. Wednesdays, 1:30-2 p.m., Sept. 29-Nov. 3, ages three and four.

CREATIVE FUN WITH BOOKS is for four- and five-year-olds. They are invited to have fun with dance, movement, skits, improvisation, music and puppet making. All centers around favorite children's books and records. This group will meet every Monday morning, 10:30-11, Sept. 27-Nov. 1.

CREATING THROUGH LITERATURE is for four- and five-year-olds. An hour a week will be filled with art projects introduced by stories or films. Activity will be cutting, pasting, painting and working with clay models and other forms of art. The class will be held Tuesdays, 1:30-2:30 p.m., starting Sept. 21. A \$3 materials fee is required with the registration.

FOR FIRST AND SECOND GRADERS the branch will offer a six-week series of craft classes based on favorite children's books and movies. It will be held Thursday afternoons, 4-5 p.m., beginning Sept. 30. Children will use paints, scissors, ink, paste, clay and other materials. A materials fee of \$2 must be paid at the time of registration.

FOR THIRD AND FOURTH GRADERS there will be a six-week investigation into the culture of different countries. The youngsters will play games, sing songs, sample foods and do craft projects relating to various countries. The class will meet Tuesdays, 4-5 p.m., beginning Sept. 29. There is a \$2 materials fee.

FOR FIFTH AND SIXTH GRADERS there is a simple cooking course. The children will prepare simple dishes inspired by some old friends from the world of books. The class will be held on Mondays from 4:15 p.m. (It begins Sept. 27). There is a \$5 materials fee.

Some of the programs at the Farmington branch library or at Liberty are similar to those at the other branch, a few are different.

ONE, TWO, WHAT'S IN THE SHOE? for preschoolers aged three to five will be a story-activity time with varied activities. It will meet Mondays, 1:30-2 p.m., starting Sept. 27 for ages four and five. Tuesdays, 10:30-11 a.m., starting Sept. 28 for ages three and four, and Thursdays, 9:30-10 a.m., starting Sept. 30 for ages three and four.

CREATING THROUGH LITERATURE is an hour a week for four- and five-year-olds. It will include art projects introduced by stories or films. The class will meet on Wednesdays, 1:30-2:30 p.m., starting Sept. 29.

FOR FIRST AND SECOND GRADERS there is a class called Stone Soup. It is a beginning course in cook cooking which means stoves won't be used. It will meet Wednesdays from 4:15 p.m., beginning Sept. 29. There is a \$3 materials fee.

FOR THIRD AND FOURTH GRADERS there will be a class called Creative Fun With Books. It will include dance, movement, skits, improvisation, music and puppet making. The class will meet Thursdays from 4:15 p.m., starting Sept. 30.

FOR FIFTH AND SIXTH GRADERS there will be a class called Early American Activities. Using books, filmstrips and records, the youngsters will learn some games, songs and crafts from the colonial days. It will be held Mondays from 4:15 p.m., beginning Sept. 27. There is a \$1 materials fee.

'Super-Ride '76' slated for Sept. 26

Sunday, Sept. 26 is the date for the area's first bike-a-thon, Super-Ride '76, being staged by the Oakland County March of Dimes in cooperation with the Michigan Bicycle Federation. Riders will be set and ready to go at 8 a.m.

Joe Pasak of Royal Oak, president of Oakland Amateur Radio Society, is the Super-Ride '76 chairman. The Catalpa ham will handle all communications at the event.

Jim Hill of Waterford Township, a two-time state champion bicycle racer, is serving as co-chairman. The idea behind Super-Ride '76 is to raise funds for bikers to obtain sponsors who will each prize a maximum of 10

cents for each mile the biker rides. In the days immediately following the ride, the biker shows his proof of how far he rode, collects the pledges and sends the money to the March of Dimes.

The 50-mile ride through Southfield, Farmington Hills and Farmington consists of four laps of a 12.5 mile course. Bikers can start either at the American Center in Southfield or at the Ten Mile Elementary School in Farmington.

Super-Ride '76 is a great way for bikers to participate in The March of Dimes' fight against birth defects while enjoying their favorite sport. —enthusiast Jim Hill


