

Artists named for Troy concert series

A line up of performing artists has been announced by the Community Concert Association of Troy to kick off the Association's premier concert season. The first concert is scheduled for Oct. 11 and the five-part series will run through March, 1977.

Performers include baritone Theodor Uppman (Oct. 11), Peter Nero (Nov. 3), the Norman Luboff Choir (Feb. 15) and the Bayanban Philippine Dance Company (March 9). A fifth concert to be held in January will be announced soon.

Series tickets are \$15 for adults, \$1.50 for students through high school. Tickets sales have begun and will culminate in a special one-week subscription drive which ends September 11. Concert attendance is by season subscription only.

Troy Concert series this season will be Bayanban, "the Philippine Islands' most beautiful dance company."

The 40-member company puts on a

stunning performance combining choreography, color and sound. Through folk dance and music, the Bayanban Company portrays the re-

gional customs of the Islands' past.

The season's fourth concert will be performed by Norman Luboff and his internationally acclaimed choir. Luboff's artistic range is unparalleled. Nowhere else will one hear a Bach chorale and a Beatles tune sung in the same program with equal artistry and understanding.

A fifth concert to complete the series by an artist of equal stature will be announced soon by the Association.

All five concerts will be held in the Troy Athens High School auditorium, John R at Wattle. The 1,800 seat auditorium is new and was designed to professional performing arts standards.

21 lions at circus

Lion tamer Wolfgang Holzmar brings 21 lions and his training mastery to Detroit's Olympia Stadium when the Biennial Edition of Ringling Bros. and Barnum and Bailey Circus arrives in Detroit on Sept. 21 for 25 performances.

Holzmar controls the largest group of lions ever presented in one cage, plunges his head into a lion's mouth and concludes his performance by carrying a 400-pound male lion on his shoulders.

The 38-year-old, German born Holzmar discovered the magic of sawdust at age 14 and has since starred in all of Europe's major circuses. "The whole atmosphere of glamour and excitement fascinated me," Holzmar recalls, "and I begged the circus to hire me. When the show left my hometown, I went with it as a stable boy."

Holzmar's participation in The Greatest Show on Earth is part of the family. Silvana Holzmar's teenage daughter, recently

made her world debut in a presentation of Liberty horses Silvana's mother recently retired from circus performing after many years as an aerialist and lion tamer.
