**Girls prepare for tennis season**

The girls tennis coaches at Farmington and North Farmington high schools predict successful seasons for their respective teams. Farmington High School, which graduated many good tennis players from last season's squad, faces a rebuilding year. Farmington Our Lady of Mercy begins its second year of girls tennis.

That's the situation in Farmington as the coaches prepare their girls for the upcoming season.

Oversh Bernie Goldenstein's Harrison girls had an excellent '75 season, going 100 overall, winning the Western So. League title and sending a doubles team as far as the quarterfinals of the Class A state meet.

Harrison graduated only one girl, Hedy Ransdell, from that team so Goldenstein is predicting another WSL title for the school.

"Maybe I shouldn't say it, but we should be the class of the league again this year based on what the other teams have come up back," Goldenstein said. "In last year's league meet, we had three of the four semi-finalists in 'A' singles.

A major change in the format of the state regional tournament, which determines who advances to the state finals, will be tested this year.

The change calls for the regional to be divided into seven separate tournaments, each corresponding to the singles or doubles competition used in the dual meets. Team points will be awarded according to their players' performances in each grouping. The top two teams in the regional tournament will advance to the state finals.

Goldenstein should be strong in No. 1 singles with junior Janice Lukaszewski. "She plays a very good all around game," Goldenstein said. "She can stay at the base line or come to the net. And she's a very consistent player. She's been playing tennis recently, winning two tournaments in the last two weeks."

Other possibilities for singles competition are junior Emily Burke and sophomore Rhonda Verona Denise Moshman. "She'll be the first to play," Goldenstein said. "She'll team with Linda Lukaszewski, Janice's sister, to form the Hawks' No. 1 doubles team this year."

North has a promising sophomore in Roslyn Pann. She'll be playing at No. 1 singles, according to Staszewski.
