Council OKs townhouses

Plans for another 11 units of townhouse development in Southfield are proceeding despite objections from neighboring residents.

Southfield City Council Sept. 13 unanimously approved a zoning switch from single-family residential to townhouse on a 14-acre parcel on the north side of Twelve Mile between Lathrop and Briarbank, owner of the property is Sam Nager and architect is Michael Nager.

The zoning on all four corners of the Twelve Mile-Lathrop intersection long a single-family residential stronghold is to rise: multiple family residential. Apartment complexes are under construction on two corners.

Mark Wayne, 2946 Briarbank, a five-year resident of the city, expressed opposition to townhouses in the area as did other homeowners.

"It's time council took a stand and stopped the proliferation of apartments in single-family residential areas," said Leonard Spicer, 2145 Briarbank.

Otto A. Pokorny died at age 88 on September 3 at the Evangelical Home for Children and Aged in Detroit from a short illness.

A native Detroit and a resident of Southfield, Mr. Pokorny graduated from Old Central High School and Michigan Agricultural College (M.S.U.) in 1909 with a degree in civil engineering. He founded the O.A. Pokorny Company, Inc. in 1920.

Mr. Pokorny belonged to the Palestine Chapter 337, F.&A.M., Detroit Commandery No. 1, K.T., Commandery Nontide Club, Detroit Engineering Society and the Detroit Yacht Club.

Survivors are his wife, Grace Finley, a daughter, Mary Katherine Nelson of St. Clair Shores, and a son, Robert B. of Birmingham.
