Kathy Hualtip one of the new generation of bowlers is leaving no doubt that she is bidding for the honor of being the Bowler of the Year. She staked a strong claim to leading contender ranking over the past weekend when she won the Mid-City Women's Open at Cherry Hill Lanes.

To gain the title she averaged 218 for the eight games in the finals. To get the average she listed games of 258, 179, 225, 182, 228, 218, 222 and 230. It was one of the best showings ever made in the Open title of the big surprise, though, was the showing of Marge Kropf, who reached the finals with one of her best showings of the year. The Plymouth housewife, who bowls in four leagues each week, came to the ultimate round against Kathy and rolled identical counts of 191 while the winner was posting games of 222 and 209.

Not content with her victory on Sunday, Kathy, bowling with the Jac Ro team,

paired the Bowlerettes Monday night with a 427.

BARBARA WALING, who rolled the area women's only perfect game last season, came back to the women's circle with a 224 game in a 307 series. She showed the way in the Thursday Mixed League at Farmington Lanes.

With this big count she beat out Fred Hamlin, co-owner of the lanes, who had a 223 in 527.

In the Friday noon Classic, Dotie Hornick took top honors with a 212 in 568.

A NEW NAME came to the front in the Laona Ladies Classic when Betty Martz waded the lane with a 325-105-430 that included a high single of 190-35-233.

In the other matches Jan Lewas won the middle game with 180-3-233 and Dorothy Gurcya took the opener with 201-28-229.

WHEN IT COMES to posting the best over average game of the year, the girls will have to go some to add Janet Chofan.

Carrying a 153 average in the Beech Nut League at Beech Lanes she came through with a 276 game. That's 123 pins over average and it could stand up as the best of the year.

THEY HAD ANOTHER close race in the Westland Classic where only 18 pins separated the top three sharpshooters.

When the final pin fell, Charles Brooks was out in front with 671 on games of 205, 224 and 212. Rick Capaldi was right behind with games of 224 and 227 in 660. Ted Bakasels landed third with 622 that included games of 214 and 213.
