Hearing set in Rochester

One of two public hearings in the Detroit metropolitan area on transportation issues has been moved to Oakland Center on the Oakland University campus in Rochester. The hearing will be at 7 p.m. Oct. 19.

A similar hearing also will be held in the auditorium of Detroit's City County Building at 7 p.m. Thursday Oct. 14.

Thomas P. O'Rourke, managing director of the Wayne County Road Commission and acting chairman of the Michigan Forum for Balanced Transportation, said that the hearing at Oakland University are being handled by John L. Gindella, managing director of the Oakland County Road Commission.

The two metropolitan area hearings are part of a schedule of six such hearings being conducted around the state this month by the Michigan Forum, which O'Rourke described as an informal coalition of 21 Michigan organizations ranging from ones tied to farmers, and including representation from public transit and highway interests, local government and several trade associations.

Contrary to a widespread impression, O'Rourke said, these hearings were not set up merely to debate Senate Bill 117, a transit funding bill for southeast Michigan that recently was enacted by the legislature.

Many of the organizations represented in the Forum objected strongly to certain provisions of the bill and to the lobbying tactics employed by its proponents. But our interest is much broader than that single piece of legislation.

We hope through these hearings to involve citizens with their legislators in a more comprehensive and constructive approach to vital transportation issues, O'Rourke said.

Smokers get 2d chance to kick the habit

Cigarette smokers interested in kicking the smoking habit have a second chance to register for the Smoking and Health Community Program's Keep the Habit Kicked gathering.

The retraining program is conducted over seven weeks from 7:15-8:45 p.m. Mondays at the Oakland County Tuberculosis Association auditorium 912 S. Woodward, Birmingham. This program will run until Nov. 22.

A late registration for the program, which began Monday, will be from 8:30-7:15 p.m. followed by a repeat of the Monday session.

The registration fee of \$21 per person or \$36 per couple may be charged on a major credit card and there is a fee refund provision.

Interested smokers may call 842-3000 around the clock to request a guaranteed registration.
