Reasons cited for this are the keynote speakers Dr. Janet Lerner, Dr. Ambrose Braxton and Dr. Donald Hammill, and about 80 scheduled seminars planned for the two days.

Lerner, a professor of special education at Northwestern Illinois University, will talk about "Learning Disabilities: Current and Future Directions." Her texts on learning disabled children are used in university training of teachers.

Braxton, who is chief of planning and

coordinating for urban education in Ohio, will talk on "Is It Fair to Compary?" Hammill will talk on "Learning Disabilities: Ain't Nobody Wants Us Down Lake We Wants Us Up." He is the author of many articles for professional journals and has co-authored 11 books.

Dr. Jack Hachtel, assistant professor of special education at Oakland University, is in charge of programming.

Farmington will supply some of the musical entertainment, with performances by the Sweet Adelades, Teen Tones and Northern Chorus. The area will be further represented with a display from the Buckeye Brigade.

James Orr, director of the learning laboratory at Oakland Community College, will conduct a session on "Cognitive Style Mapping," and Farmington teachers John Walner and Sally Stewart will discuss "Four Walls—and Then What?"

Myrna Henderson of the Farmington schools will discuss "Building Listening Skills," and much behind-the-scenes organization will be handled by Farmington residents.

About 100 alumni have volunteered to phone members of the classes of 1929 through 1975 to solicit contributions for the college's general operating fund this month.

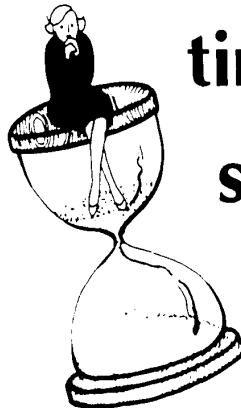
