The hand in the diagram was dealt at the weekly duplicate game at Oakland University. Keith Gardels and Ruth Pokutsky held the North-South cards.

Ruth, sitting South had the so-called "book" notrump opening. Keith bid two clubs (The Stayman Convention) asking South to bid a four card major suit. When spades were named, Keith bid five notrump and Ruth bid the grand slam in spades.

Voter guides available

The West Bloomfield Farmington Area League of Women Voters have 19000 copies of the Oakland County Voter Guide ready for distribution.

They are available at the two Farmington Community Libraries, the West Bloomfield and Westlawn Libraries, all elementary schools and churches, and the Farmington and Farmington Hills municipal buildings and West Bloomfield Township Hall.

The free, non-partisan voter guide prepared for the Nov. 2 general election, includes candidate information for the offices of U.S. Senate, U.S. representative, state representative, state supreme court, court of appeals, state educational boards, probate court, circuit court, district court.

Oakland County offers and board of commissions and all state ballot issues.

The guides contain biographical information and responses to questions pertinent to the office the candidate seeks. All candidates running for the same office respond to the same questions.

Its purpose is to enable the public to study the candidates and issues in order that the individual may cast a more informed vote.
