

Bridge

The hand in the diagram was dealt at the Regional tournament in Milwaukee last weekend. Most pairs bid seven spades and had no problems. One club loser disappears on the heart ace and the other one is trumped in dummy. Several pairs reached seven notrump and that also is a laydown because the diamond queen is doubleton. However, declarer doesn't know this until late in the play and a few careless declarers went down because of finessing the diamond.

Contract: 7 Notrump by South
 West led the King of hearts
 South can count 12 tricks — seven spades, one heart, two diamonds and two clubs.
 The ace of hearts captured the king and declarer decided to cash the spades. West had seven discards, North and East, four. West discarded three hearts and four clubs; dummy, three hearts keeping the jack and one diamond; East, two hearts and two clubs.
 Declarer now cashed clubs and counted. West had no club left, so must play diamonds. He can't discard the heart queen for then the jack in dummy would be good.
 Attack 11 declarer played the king of diamonds and then led a small diamond toward the board. When West followed the queen would drop, for West as marked with the heart queen and East held the club queen, so the diamond queen had to be unguarded.

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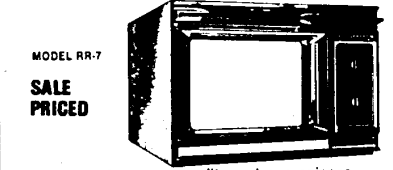
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
