Teased hair is out and long hair in, says Kazan

Michel Kazan, the international hair designer, who designs the hair styles for many of the Paris couturiers, says "teased hair" is out.

When Michel Kazan makes that kind of statement, everybody listens, because he's the one who originated the bouffant Jackie Kennedy Onassis' hairdresser, Kenneth, was Kazan's protégé.

Kazan is presently touring his 22 salons and was available for consultation recently at his Bonwit Teller salon in Somerset Mall.

"I took my long hair, held together with pins and hair-spray, into a top knot, into the Kazan Salon and said 'Help!'"

Michel Kazan said "out of date vs. up to date" and proceeded to design as hairstyle for me. He works with hair as other designers work with fabric—draping the hair first to show how it will look.

After the shampoo, the seasoning, and the blow dry, I was told to shake my head vigorously. Then a touch up here and there with the curling iron and I emerged wearing the ingenious Kazan cut—full of movement, short, loose and full.

MICHEL KAZAN, who spends most of his time in Paris and New York, insists "You cannot say today (that the mid-west is not elegant).

"Women are very up to date here. There is no difference now between New York, Europe and the midwest."

"Women are very sentimental. They continue to wear their hair as they did in their 20s and it makes them look dated—older. The natural look that exudes femininity is young."

He warned that the pace of fashion is fast and the look changes every six months.

"Long hair is coming in," he predicted, "waved with a Marcel iron or twisted into the chignon effect but still soft and feminine."

Roger Orr, formerly of Expressively Orr's, has joined the Kazan staff as style director and manager of the Bonwit Teller salon. His wife Sharon is comanager and she,



along with the entire staff of stylists, reflect the free, relaxed, contemporary woman fashion in hair.

Marsha Cla Cardosa of Ortonville was there, having her monthly cut by Roger. Marsha has her own jumper stable of 100 horses and easily combines her morning shampoo and blow dry with her busy schedule. She said "I love the freedom of my Kazan cut—the way it moves and bounces."

Orr recommends natural hair coloring, saying "henna adds body—grey hair can be very pretty—as a woman gets older hair should be allowed to lighten."

APPRENTICE hairdresser Donna Salvadore of Dryden explained the technique of brushing and blow drying.

"Follow shampoo with hair conditioner and setting lotion. Your blow dryer should have 1,000 watts and be held about one inch away from the hair brush. Brush out, up and under as you blow."

And that's all there is to being up to date.

The other major area of concern in updating your fashion look is makeup. Bonwit was holding a beauty clinic on the first floor with Etherea beauty expert Linda Howe counseling customers on their cosmetic needs. Joan Pappas, Bonwit's cosmetic buyer, said "you can update last year's clothes with this year's makeup."

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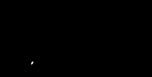


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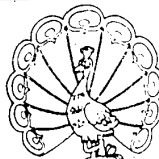
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
