Lathrup swimmers top Lahser

The girls' swimming teams from Southfield Lathrup and Bloomfield Hills Lahser have developed an intense rivalry since the schools became members of the Metro Suburban Association four years ago.

In past seasons, Lahser usually managed to outswim Lathrup whenever the teams locked up in a dual meet. But not this year. Lathrup downed Lahser, 90-82, in an MSA meet last Thursday in Lathrup's pool.

Lathrup's victory did two things. It lifted the Chargers to 7-4 overall and 1-1 in the MSA, and it left coach Pete Hagen more optimistic about his team's chances in the five-team league.

Bloomfield Groves is going to win the thing, no doubt about that. Hagen said.

But second through fifth, all the way down the line, that's a tossup right now. I think.

The Lathrup-Lahser meet was close throughout and wasn't decided until the last event, the 400-yard freestyle relay. Lathrup's relay, led by Sattler, Lori Boyd, Laura Crosswaite and Lisa Hless, won in 4:02.4. Crosswaite also won two individual events: the 200 individual medley in 2:32.9 and the 100 butterfly in 1:04.7. Hless won the 200 freestyle in 2:02.2 and the 100 breaststroke in 1:16.2.

Sattler topped the 50 freestyle in 27.54 while teammate Linda Carter won the 500 freestyle in 4:06.7. Lathrup freshman Ramon Mansfield set a varsity record in

diving with 151.50 points.

Earlier last week, Birmingham Seaholm defeated Lathrup, 100-72, in a non-league meet. Crosswaite was a double winner, taking the 200 IM in 2:24.1 and the 500 free in 3:27.6. Hless won the 100 breaststroke in 1:16.0 and finished second in the 100 butterfly in 1:03.3.

GLIAC cross country run

Area runners stand out

Hillsdale College placed four runners in the top ten, was the winner of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Conference (GLIAC) cross country meet held over the weekend at Oakland University.

Hillsdale's John Vurcha completed the five-mile course on the recently opened Kelleysburg golf course in a time of 25:49. The 1974 Division III All American was followed in order by Bob Englehorn of Ferris State College (26:36), Peter Gies of Hillsdale (26:45), Jack Alexander of Wayne State University (26:24) and Tom Stark of Hillsdale (26:30).

Scott Stone, a graduate of Southfield High School, was the fourth Hillsdale runner to place among the top ten contestants.

Oakland University, led by the inspired running of freshman Mike Redford, finished fourth in the team standings behind runners-up Wayne State and Ferris Northwood Institute. Grand Valley State College and Lake Superior State College completed the bottom third of the seven participating GLIAC schools.

Redford, a freshman from Farmington Hills in High School, by virtue of his fourth place finish, became the first runner in Pioneer history to make the GLIAC All-Conference team. He completed the course in 29:52.

The remaining Pioneer runners competing in the meet were Duane Stewart (29th), Graham Walker (29th), Pete Salas (29th) and Mark Tischler (29th). Tischler is a graduate of Adams High School, located near Southfield.

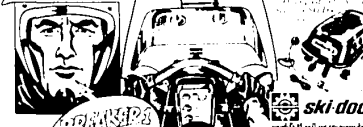

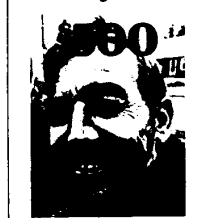
