Included are specific directions for homeowners, com-mercial, agricultural and mu-nicipal users of DDT.

Preparation of the guidelines was a joint project of the Mich-igan Departments of Agricul-ture, Natural Resources, and Public Health, in cooperation with Michigan State University.

DO EARWIGS BUG YOU? If you've got earligs—those ugly pests with a pair of pincers on lack—try this trick for eradicating them: Take a piece of cloth (a man's skirt, old apron, etc.) and hang it on a base of a tree, putting several pieces all over, about 18 inches above ground. About twice a week take a pail haif full of hot water and just scrape the earwigs off with your hand, and the hot water does rest; Don't shake the cloth's as you'll lose a lot. You can even dip the rags into the pail. Some readers tell us the've caught hundreds of earwigs this way.
