

Schedule Hearings On Consolidation

A schedule has been approved for regional public education meetings to discuss the question of forming a single city from the four governmental units in the Farmington area.

The schedule was formed at the last meeting of the Joint Study Committee of the four governments which has been meeting to discuss the consolidation question.

THE JOINT Committee unanimously agreed to sponsor a single meeting in the city and each of the villages and two

In the townships

Speakers for and against consolidation will be selected from the municipalities where the meeting is being held.

Format selected for the meetings is: each side will be given 10 minutes to speak followed by a five minute rebuttal; meeting will conclude with an hour of questions and discussion from the floor. Each meeting will be moderated by a member of the Joint Committee.

Schedule of meetings is: Oct. 2, in Sarah Fisher Home for Wood Creek Farms residents; Oct. 8 in East Junior High for township residents; Oct. 13 in First Presbyterian Church for Quakerstown residents; Oct. 15 in Farmington Junior High for city residents; Oct. 22 in Dunckley Junior High for township residents.

Schedule of the meetings was reported Monday night at the City Council meeting.

AT THE SAME session, the council approved low bids totaling \$30,836 for asphalt paving, curb and gutters, and storm drains on Alta Loma Drive from Gill Rd. to Cass Avenue.

The city will absorb the cost of the storm drain since flooding problems effect streets

other than Alta Loma. For the other improvements, cost to residents on Alta Loma will be \$4.50 per lineal foot.

The city's share in the project, for which it will sell bonds, is estimated at \$20,000, with assessments totaling about \$14,000.

The accepted bids for the sewer work were: storm sewer, \$15,059, Lannucci Contracting Co; curb and gutters, \$11,152, Edward R. White Co; asphalt resurfacing, \$4,625, Nagle Paving Co.

In separate action, the assessment role for storm drainage in Woodcroft Subdivision was set at a cost to residents of \$5.50 per lineal foot.

A REQUEST to make Warner one-way street, south between Shawasssee and Thoms Street, was tabled until the next meeting pending a report from the Director of Public Safety.

The resignation of McCossett Peterson from the planning commission was accepted and his replacement is expected to be named at the next council session. Peterson resigned because of pressures from his business.

The planning commission has named Richard Tupper to replace Peterson as chairman of the commission. Tupper is a township redevelopment planner. Replacing Peterson on the subcommittee will be Russell Milligan.

United Foundation was granted permission to hold its 21st annual Torch Drive in the city during October and November.

The City of Hope was given permission to place canisters throughout the city from Sept. 23-Dec. 23 to raise money for the Medical Center in California.

Commons Plagued By Vandalism

Vandals have done over \$2,000 worth of damage to construction equipment and to homes in the Independence Commons development over the last three months.

Broken windows and headlights, slashed tires, stolen tools, and sand poured into cranks and gas tanks have plagued contractors in the new subdivision.

Larry Wojtowicz, owner of Larry's Trucking, a subcontractor in the development, told The Enterprise and Observer that he has even been sleeping out in the subdivision at night to ward off vandalism.

In a report to the police, he related that one evening, three youths on motorcycles entered the development and began to do some minor damage.

Then as Wojtowicz chased them, the report indicates, the youths turned on his car, doing \$50 worth of damage to it.

Wojtowicz said that the destruction has abated somewhat during the last week because township police patrols have begun to patrol the area.

Complaints from the homeowners and contractors in the development alerted the police to the problem and urged better coverage of the area by them.
