Then the groups will combine for a Christmas portion of voices, recorders and percussion instruments.

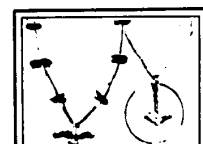

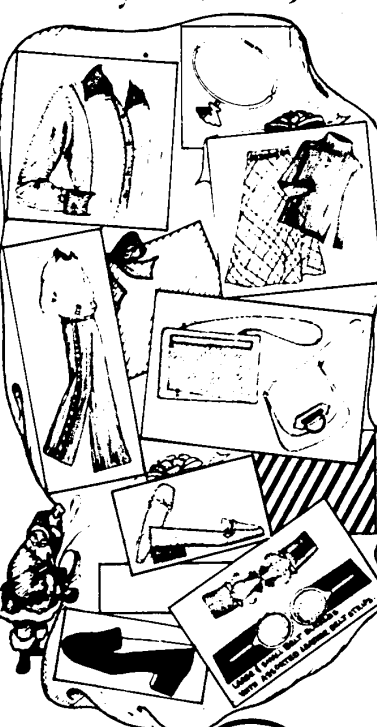
