BOND DETAILS: Said special assessment and general obligation bonds will be coupon bonds of the denomination of \$1,000.00 and \$5,000.00 each, dated October 1, 1978, maturing in direct order of maturity from 1 year and 6 months to 20 years, and will bear interest from their date payable on September 1, 1979, and semi-annually thereafter. INTEREST RATE AND BIDDING DETAILS: The bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding 7% per annum to be fixed by the bids therefore, except in the case of 1, 4 or 10 years of maturity, in which case the interest on any one bond shall be at one rate only. All bonds maturing in any one year must carry the same interest coupon. The difference between the highest and lowest interest rate on the bonds shall not exceed two percentage points. No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the bonds or at a price less than 100% of their par value will be considered.

PAYING AGENT: Both principal and interest shall be payable at a bank or trust company located in Michigan qualified to act as paying agent under State or United States law, to be designated by the original purchaser of the bonds, who may also designate a co-paying agent, which may be located outside of Michigan, qualified to act as paying agent under the law of the State in which located or of the United States, both of which shall be subject to approval of the undersigned.

PURPOSE AND SECURITY OF SPECIAL ASSESSMENT BONDS: The bonds are issued in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for street improvements in special assessment districts Nos. 7645 and 7646 in said City, as set forth in the bond authorizing resolution. The special assessments and interest thereon are sufficient to pay the principal and interest on the bonds as when due. The liability of each special assessment district is limited as set forth in the bond authorizing resolution. The bonds will pledge the full faith and credit of the City as additional security for payment of the principal and interest thereon.

PURPOSE AND SECURITY OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS: The bonds are issued for the purpose of paying part of the City's portion of the cost of street improvements in said special assessment districts in the City. The bonds will pledge the full faith and credit of the City of Farmington, Michigan for payment of the principal and interest thereon and will be payable from ad valorem taxes, which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount.

GOOD FAITH: A certified or cashier's check in the amount of \$250.00, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company and payable to the order of the Treasurer of the City must accompany each bid as a guarantee of good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such bid is accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the bonds. No interest shall be allowed on the good faith checks and check of the unsuccessful bidder will be promptly returned to each bidder's representative or by registered mail. The good faith check of the successful bidder will be immediately cashed and payment for the balance of the purchase price of the bonds shall be made at the closing.

AWARD OF BONDS: The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid produces the lowest interest cost computed by determining, at the rate or rates specified in the bid, the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds from January 1, 1977, to their maturity and deducting therefrom any premium.

"This is the most impressive group of recruits anywhere," said Haase. "Sure, just a few, but I got what I consider to be an outstanding group of individuals."

"I have a five-year goal of being a national caliber wrestling team and I believe we're well on our way. As a matter of fact, we're a little ahead of schedule. We're very young, but we have power, tucked potential," said Haase enthusiastically.

Spreading the list of top caliber recruits is the only outside wrestler, 18-year-old Tim Chapel of Farmington Hills High School. Chapel was a runner-up in the 1975 and '76 wrestling regionals and qualified for the class B state finals.

THE OU FRESHMAN, who hopes to major in biology, was captain of his high school team last season and was awarded the team's Most Pins award (24). Haase believes Chapel will "play a major role in Oakland University wrestling."

Another major acquisition was East Detroit's Phil LeBlond, who finished the 1976 season with a 38-2 mark. Participating in the Eastern Michigan League, he qualified for the district, won the regional championship and placed third in the state class A finals.

"This is probably one of our brightest spots for the coming season," said Haase. "He broke all of his high school records and was the Most Valuable Wrestler. Most points awarded winner and captain of the team. He has senior year."

Kunta's award will also benefit the return of seven lettermen including co-captains Rich Halmgren and Dean Waldrop.

Halmgren, a 20-year-old junior from Hazel Park High School, was champion of the Southeastern Michigan League in 1973 and '74. He transferred back to Farmington after spending last year at an outstate

school and will wrestle in the 131 to 142 pound category. As a 19-year-old sophomore, Waldrop earned a variety letter last year. He is a graduate of Madison Heights High School where he competed in the Oakland Athletic League.

Tennis facility planned

Oakland County's Parks and Recreation Commission has received a tentative grant from the Department of Natural Resources to develop a major tennis complex. The complex will be at Waterford Oaks County Park, the geographical center of Oakland County.

This tennis complex is Phase II of an overall park development that includes the present water pool and also is to include ball diamonds, nature facilities and other recreational activities.

The tennis complex's purpose is to provide a regional tennis facility that would appeal to tournament play for outdoor tennis. Eventually, a tennis stadium is expected to be built on the site.

"There has been some concern by the private sector that this tennis facility will compete with the tennis houses and possibly affect their membership," said Eric Rebeck, director of Oakland County Parks and Recreation.

In order to relieve any apprehensions and to hear both sides of the story, a public hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, Nov. 27, 3:30 p.m. at the Waterford Oaks Activities Center, 28 Watkins Lake Road, Waterford Township, at the west boundaries of the Oakland County Service Center.

The commission would like input from residents on whether they would consider such a facility an asset to the tennis community of Oakland County and the metropolitan area.

THE MASTER PLAN will be available at the meeting, and Jack Anderson from Anderson, Lennox, Recreation Consultants will present the overall concept. Members of the Parks and Recreation Commission and staff will be present to answer any questions.

The State Department of Natural Resources has given the commission its preliminary approval for \$200,000 for the phase of the development.

Phase two development of Waterford Oaks, which is scheduled for completion next year, will include installation of eight lighted tennis courts, 10 lighted shuffleboard courts, four lighted deck tennis courts, 10 lighted horseshoe courts parking for 100 cars and a vehicle drive, a comfort station, administration building and landscaping.

The concept for this phase of development for Waterford Oaks County Park is to provide a tennis complex for daily play and instruction and a continuous program of tournament play for all ages and levels of competition.

EVENTUALLY, WITH the following phase development, the complex will include 24 lighted tennis courts, eight lighted deck tennis courts, an 800-seat tennis stadium, 19 lighted horseshoe courts, a children's play center, parking for 300 cars and an expanded administration building for senior citizens' activities.

The concept for the entire Waterford Oaks County Park is to establish it as an active sports center. This will not only accommodate day use activity, but a day camp and clinic for instructional in traditional to all types of sports.

Earlier this year, phase one was completed. This includes the water action swimming pool and bicycle motorcross course.
