Interfaith Center plans silent auction

The Northwest Interfaith Center will sponsor its second annual Holiday Silent Auction Dec. 2 in the Northwest YMCA on Grand River, west of Beech Daily.

Cecile Ann Beaman, spokeswoman for the center, asks area residents to donate "anything old or new" to be part of the auction. Donors are asked to bring contributions to the Y before 7 p.m. the day of the event.

The auction will get under way at 7:30 p.m.

Last year items for the auction included art and hand crafted items, baked and canned goods and services. Ms. Beaman said "The services included the use of a truck, babysitting, and a lawyer who offered to write a will."

The center is now in its fifth year working to help race relations in the Detroit area.

Ms. Beaman described the silent auction: "A myriad of donated creations and services are displayed on tables with bid sheets attached to each item. During the first part of the evening, guests shop around and bid on the item they want by writing their name and bid on a bid sheet. "Your bid can be crossed off by another buyer who wants to pay more for the item than you do, so you must keep checking to see that you will be giving the highest bid when time is called." "Then each item is announced with the winner's name and the winning price. You pay as you leave with your newly acquired treasures." Refreshments will be served. There is no admission charge. Cash and check donations are tax deductible.
